

"If"

Rudyard Kipling wrote his classic poem "If". In his poem, he encourages his readers to ponder numerous life situations that could come to fruition based on one's ability to negotiate the temptations and vicissitudes (the ups and downs) of life. After reading and contemplating Kipling's poem, I am left with the impression that Kipling squarely places the responsibility on the shoulders of the person who experiences these possibilities to determine how the life situations are handled. This may be the poet's intention; however, I would prefer that readers of this classic poem take another approach to successfully navigating the sometimes tortuous roads of life.

I maintain that God makes a way for those human beings who have a personal relationship with Him through the acceptance of the perfect sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ. God directs His people "if" they choose to follow the way He has established. The Way is Jesus Christ as John recorded in John 14:6 where Jesus tells his disciples and Thomas specifically, "I am the way, the truth, and the life..." (KJV) Those of us who have a "saving" relationship with Jesus Christ will accept Jesus as "The Way", and therefore, learn to recognize the benefits and consequences of the "ifs" we encounter in our lives.

Kipling suggests that as human beings we have the ability within ourselves to decipher the "ifs." The decisions we make concerning the "ifs" in our lives are generally temporary solutions to generally temporary situations. The "ifs" God recommends for humanity have eternal consequences.

Scriptural examples found in our Bible provide life-changing solutions to the "ifs" of life that will be for our good or for our detriment.

- II Chronicles 7:14 describes how God will bless His people, the people of Israel, "if" they will humble themselves and are obedient to His instructions: "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." (KJV)
- John 14:23 relates to us how we can make the correct decisions when faced with the "ifs" of our lives. When we love Jesus, we have the blessing of divine fellowship with Him: "Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him." (KJV)
- A decision to follow our own way of thinking when faced with an "if" situation in our lives can lead to disobedience to God. The people of Israel experienced this as we see recorded in I Samuel 12:15, "But if ye will not obey the voice of the Lord, but rebel against the commandment of the Lord, then shall the hand of the Lord be against you, as it was against your fathers." (KJV)

"If" is a small word, however, it can mean the difference between obedience and disobedience, between success and failure. Daily, we are tempted to rely on our own wisdom to guide us as we come to points in our lives when decisions must be made to determine the benefits or consequences of "if" I do this, or "if" I do that. No matter how tempting the situation may present itself, we are the wiser to ask God for His guidance rather than follow the recommendation of the author of the poem "If". We are God's people, and we must let God show us how to correctly encounter our "ifs".

Deaconess Roxie Hooks, Union Baptist Church Member Since 1959

The conversation, 'IF I Say Hi'.

How many times have you sat in Church and looked around and just wanted to say hello? Starting the conversation with the person sitting next to you in church should not be difficult. During the conversation I experienced numerous emotions; however I left with pride and joy that she wanted to spend time with me. Would I have come out thanking God for what he has done for me, as she does?
