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Session #2 Seeking ... a Prerequisite!

God remains hidden to the casual inquirer. Jer. 29: 13 says that, "you shall seek me and find me, *when you search* for me with all your heart." Critical to our finding God is our own willingness to "seek" for him. God wants to be known, and He longs to reveal himself to those who want him. In this session we will look to a powerful scriptural model to help us learn how to seek Him.

 - 3. Rate your life in the area of confident, expectant Prayer.
- 4. Rate your life as a conduit of God's Power.
 - 5. Rate your level of Freedom from worry, anxiety, and fear.
 - 6. Rate your level of Mercy and Compassion for those in pain or suffering injustice.
- 7. Rate your committed Participation and Service to the body of Christ.
