REMEMBERING A LEDGEWOOD LEGACY

Early last month, Ledgewood Christian Church observed its 53rd birthday. On Easter Sunday, April 4, 1965, the newly formed congregation, temporarily named West Geauga Christian Church, met at Westwood School on Caves Road for its first worship service. For the next three years, each Sunday morning, a group of church members would arrive early to set up the worship area in the school gymnasium. They unlocked the storage room and brought out the chairs, the organ, the communion table, the lectern, the pulpit and the hymn books. Elements of Communion were prepared in the school cafeteria kitchen. After each service, everything was returned to storage, ready for the next Sunday. Russell Township was a fast-growing community at that time; and, on October 10, 1965, the church's official State Charter was signed by 127 adults and 32 youth. At the same time, the name of Ledgewood Christian Church (*Disciples of Christ*) was adopted.

Fast forward a half century plus three, and, on April 10, 2018, we were saddened to receive word that Charter Member, Janet Kesler, had passed away at age 97. She was the last remaining member who had been in the congregation on that Easter Sunday in 1965, as well as on Charter Sunday, October 10, 1965. She was not only actively involved in the formation of the new congregation and seeing the new building come to fruition, she continued to dedicate her time and talents to serving the Lord at Ledgewood Church in many ways: Elder, Deaconess, choir member, Church Treasurer, member and officer of the Christian Women's Fellowship, to name just a few. She often served as Sunshine Chairperson of the church, sending cards and notes to members and friends as occasions arose or to let folks know that we had missed seeing them in worship. She attended Sunday School regularly and volunteered to help with many activities in the church, always



wanting to support others in the work of Ledgewood. Jan was very vital to the success of our annual rummage sale, organizing the books and toys section and assisting customers and children with their purchases. She also served as our Saturday cashier when called upon.

When I first visited Ledgewood Christian Church early in 1966, Jan was quick to welcome me. Soon after joining the church, I was appointed to the Board of Deaconesses; and Jan was the one who coached me in the preparation of Communion. With our kitchen then being that of the school cafeteria, after the worship service, we washed the Communion elements in the huge deep cafeteria sinks.

Over the years, through church, Jan and I became close **b**uddies: **b**ookkeeping **b**uddies, **b**aseball **b**uddies, **b**ell ringing **b**uddies.



In the early 1970's, during tax season, we worked together in the office of another Ledgewood Charter Member, CPA Ralph Duckworth, typing data into tax forms. That was before computers were in every office and Turbo Tax had been invented - when one had to sandwich carbon paper between 4 blank tax forms, load the package into the typewriter and type in all the information on a specific line, hoping to not make any mistakes which would require carefully correcting each individual copy. For many years, at Ledgewood, Jan and I worked together as Treasurer and Financial Secretary. I recorded the money coming in; Jan, recorded it on the way out.

Jan was always a huge baseball fan, even before the Indians got "hot" in the 1990's. That's when we became **b**aseball **b**uddies. Thanks to her son-in-law, we were able to

purchase a number of season ticket packages for those exciting games. Our seats were all in Row U--that's 5 rows from the top---but right behind home plate. What fun we had! Jan was always "scolding" the players like a mom. "Now Omar, why didn't you catch that ball!" One day we got to stroll the bases after the game and had our picture taken standing at second base at Jacob's Field.

Jan and I were **b**ell-ringing **b**uddies, too. Her dedication to the Ledgewood bell choir made it possible for us to cover two octaves even with our small numbers. I rang notes G and A above middle C; Jan rang F and G an octave higher. Her high "G" was critical to some of our Christmas selections, and she was there, ringing right on time!

Now, in keeping with all the "**b**" words I've used thus far, another comes to mind: **B**roccoli Salad. Jan's was the **b**est! And, it was a requested favorite at Ledgewood pot-lucks.

I am **b**lessed to have lived the history of Ledgewood Christian Church, and my life is **b**etter for experiencing the friendship of Janet Kesler. Likewise, Ledgewood Christian Church has surely been **b**lessed by Jan's love for the church and the Lord.






