

#### A Note from the Pastor:



Sunday, June 7<sup>th</sup> **Trinity Sunday** is the first Sunday after Pentecost and is celebrated by

> many Christians in the United States. It is one of the few feasts that are celebrated as a doctrine of the church instead of an event. It is also

symbolic of the unity of the Trinity.

Sunday, June 14th **Flag Day** commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States,

which happened on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental

Congress.

Sunday, June 21st **Father's Day,** celebrated in the United States on the third Sunday of June,

got a jump start from the formation of Mother's Day. At the turn of the century, Mother's Day observances were growing across the United States. It was during a Mother's Day church service on June 20, 1909, that Sonora Smart Dodd was struck with the idea of creating a special holiday to honor

fathers, too.

Thursday, July 4<sup>th</sup> **Independence Day** *commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of* 

*Independence in 1776 by the Continental Congress.* 

Wednesday, July 15<sup>th</sup> **Tax Day** is marked by many United States residents as the deadline to file their income taxes with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The date is
