



The Pastor's Letter



Thanksgiving 2017

November is the time of year we set aside for the national holiday of Thanksgiving. We have much to be thankful for and it is a great tradition for Americans to celebrate together. According to History.com "the holiday feast dates back to November 1621, when the newly arrived Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Indians gathered at Plymouth for an autumn harvest celebration, an event regarded as America's "first Thanksgiving." The Washington Post acknowledges the traditional origins but says there is another reason that the Thanksgiving holiday has become an American ritual: "As a national event, the holiday dates to 1863. That year, President Lincoln proclaimed "a day of Thanksgiving and Praise" for the nation's blessings in the face of the Civil War that was raging. Why, then, do we associate Thanksgiving with the Pilgrims? In the late 1800s, with immigrants - Jews, Italians, Chinese, other outsiders – pouring in, America's cultural leaders took two bits of shaky historic evidence from the early 1600s and embraced a story of a Pilgrim Thanksgiving in an effort to Americanize an increasingly diverse population." In other words, Thanksgiving celebrates the ethnic and cultural diversity of

America and the unity we have as "one nation under God." Thanksgiving has always been associated with food and harvest time. The Pilgrims and the Indians brought the best of the harvest to eat as they shared a meal together. Food has a way of uniting people. We enjoy the feast and the fellowship and experience new favorite ethnic recipes. Food transcends and unites cultures. When we "break bread together" we are breaking down the walls that separate us. It is no accident that Jesus used food to bring us together around a common table in order to remember him. Enjoying food together solidifies new relationships. I hope this Thanksgiving brings you into new bonds of unity and friendship.

I am thankful for friends, church family, and countless others who prayed for me and helped me get back to normal routines. I thank God daily for life, health, and breath. Life is a gift and we all need to give thanks for this precious time God has given to us. So when I carve the turkey this year, I am going to rejoice and give thanks for my family and you! November has some important events that you will want to attend. We can worship with Faith Church pastored by Kevin Thorpe as they celebrate their 40th anniversary as a church.

Dr. Joel Gregory is the featured speaker and one of the foremost preachers in the world today.
