






The Pastor's Letter



MISSIONS 18

The year 2017 was eventful and full of ups and downs at Parkview Baptist Church. If you consider all that has happened, you may be tempted to wonder how we survived such an eventful year. But as always, God is good, Jesus oversees his church, and the Lord sees us through on this earthly journey.

The church saw several staff changes this year. Shane Johnson, who served us well for several years, resigned to become Executive Director of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Alachua County. Shane is well-equipped for this position and has already made needed changes and improvements to the organization. Mario Martinez was moved from part-time Minister of Music to full time Minister of Education and Music. His leadership this past year has been phenomenal as he navigated leaving a full- time teaching job to becoming full time in ministry again. He and his family have blessed our church family and Mario has impacted our church with fresh ideas and enthusiasm. Lazaro Armada was brought on as an Associate Pastor and worked with our youth ministry. He quickly raised attendance and activities for the youth and by the fall had a strong, growing youth group. Laz developed health problems that kept him from fulfilling his responsibilities and sadly resigned because of health issues. Any one of these staff changes would have been major in the normal flow of church life, but Parkview was able to adjust and prosper despite these changes. That is a tribute to our church family and God's grace.

Then there was my heart attack. I was rushed to the ER in August with breathing issues and after a heart cath was found to have three blockages in my heart. The doctors immediately put me into surgery and repaired my heart with triple by-pass surgery. It was later discovered that my heart was not beating properly so they added a pacemaker a few days later. For the next six weeks, I was in recovery mode and worked to get my strength back. I was finally able to make it back to work on a limited basis. In the meantime, the church stepped up to not only maintain the normal activities of the church but also to minister to me and my family in a remarkably caring and loving way. I will forever be grateful to the church and all my friends and family who supported me with their prayers and cards and service. This again is a tribute to our church family and God's grace.

The year 2017 also saw us lose some stalwart members and people of great faith who made Parkview what it is today. Kenneth Langdon, Richard Gailey, Kim Bell, Evelyn Casey, Anne Daley, Sarah Hudson, Patricia Durant, Diana Gay Long and Louise Mott passed away during 2017. We will miss them and all the contributions they made to our church. Once again, the church provided care and concern in loving and tangible ways to let these families know how much their loved ones were appreciated.

God is good, and your actions are a tribute to our church family.

All the ups and downs of 2017 have affected our attendance and programs. We have had to scramble to have teaching and leadership positions filled. This is positive in the sense that some people have taken on new responsibilities and have volunteered in ways that they have not done before. Adversity often creates opportunity and some of our members have trusted the Lord to guide them into new roles in our church family. We praise God for this. On the down side, attendance has declined, and we have had to restart some programs that were affected by staff changes. My absence seems to have led some who were thinking of joining to no longer consider doing so. Others have taken a wait and see attitude to see if the church can recover from so many changes. We are on the road to recovery, but we still need to be faithful to the task.

That leads me to **Mission 2018.** We need to refocus our commitment to reach out to the community and lead the unbelievers and unchurched to Jesus. Our motto for Mission 2018 is Share His Love to emphasize our purpose of Evangelism. Our guiding verse this year is 1 John 4:10-14: "This is love: not that we loved God. but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins...And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world." Our objective for the New Year is that "we will tell others by word and action that God loves us and sent his Son Jesus to forgive our sins and to be our **Savior.**" The only way our church will grow is if we share his love.

Will you join me in this new mission for 2018? The first commitment you can make is to pray the 5 BLESSings prayer for 5 people, 5 minutes a day, 5 days a week, for 5 weeks and Invite your friends and neighbors to attend the Ravi Zacharias Open Forum at the O'Connell Center on January 25, 2018. We will be sharing information about the event in January, but you can begin to think of five unchurched friends and family members who need to know Jesus as Savior. You can begin to pray for them and then invite them to the forum. God has been good to us this past year. You have been amazing. Let's continue to Share His Love in 2018.
