



Pentecostal Tabernacle International is organized as a not for profit religious organization that operates exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law). Pentecostal Tabernacle was birthed in June of 1996. Subsequently, the organization has grown to include affiliate churches in the following locations, West Palm Beach, Kissimmee, the Turks and Caicos Islands, Cayman Islands and Iglesia Tabernaculo in Miami Gardens. It is the vision of Pentecostal Tabernacle to continue to proclaim the gospel to all men irrespective of location and situation.

In anticipation of the changes in times and technology, we are always in pursuit of methods that will allow us to reach the world with the glorious gospel of Jesus Christ. We continue to have a strong commitment to the education of children by way of PenTab Academy, as well as an effective Institutional Ministry. We have been successful in launching a Christian bookstore, a Christian school, and a multimedia center (Focus Media). We currently support missions in many regions of the world, namely Ethiopia, Jamaica, the Philippines, Guyana and the Turks and Caicos Islands.



PASTOR'S REPORT



reetings to the Pentecostal Tabernacle family in the exalted name of Jesus! I cannot find enough words to express my appreciation to our Lord and Savior who, by his keeping power, has sustained us through another challenging year, which has gone by so swiftly. Our ministry leaders will give you more detailed information with respect to various areas of our ministry, but allow me to highlight some achievements and restate the challenges.

THE KINGDOM CULTURE - Two years ago we started to focus greater attention on the preservation and maximization of the Kingdom Culture. While progress has been made, it is evident that the forces against that life style are greater now than they have ever been. Therefore, we are forced to continue under that banner by asking every member of Pentecostal Tabernacle to be passionately committed to Intentional Personal Growth.

THE GREAT COMMISSION - We are thankful for those who continue to be faithful in the area of spreading the good news, but we did not realize our objective of a thorough and consistent "Door to Door" campaign. We conducted our largest and most well attended 'Under the Sky' meeting ever, which involved most of the churches in the community and, without question, lives were touched by the Holy Spirit.

FAMILY/FINANCIAL/HEALTH ISSUES -

Through the ministry of Fellowship, YLOV, YMOP, and Care Inc., we continue to focus

on these vital areas, knowing that the strength of the family, proper financial management, and the maintenance of good health are key factors in the personal and spiritual growth of our members.

APOSTOLIC VILLAGE - Very little was done in the area of property development during the year under review, but I am happy to report that a working group, under the leadership of Bro. Harry Ramcharan, has been established to start working on a proposal that he submitted a few years ago.

UNITED IN BUILDING

- We replaced the carpet along the office hallway with tiles, and re-carpeted the offices.
- We installed awnings for all the rear doors of the main building, as well as the walkway leading from Care and the Fellowship Hall to the Southeast rear door of the main building. An awning was also added to give covering for the outside step leading to the second floor of the building.
- The refurbishing of the 621 & 638 buildings was not done.
- The new DVR System to accommodate additional security cameras was installed and we added fourteen cameras to bring the total number of security cameras to twenty-seven.
- For security reasons, we added two doors to the main hallway. This has helped to limit public access to the building during school hours.
- We purchased and installed 3 new aircondition units located on the roof of the main building, to replace the old units.
- We replaced our old sound equipment with a new digital system and added LED stage lights.
- The establishment of the Music School was not realized.

TAMPA PROPERTY - The decision was made to sell the Tampa property and we have secured a Real Estate Broker to list the property for us.

PENTAB AFFILIATES - Please see the reports from West Palm Beach, Turks & Caicos Islands, Iglesia Tabernaculo, Kissimmee and The Cayman Islands. During the year, we added Kissimmee and Freeport Bahamas, to the list of affiliates. Bro. Winston Miller is providing interim leadership to PenTab, Kissimmee, and with his leadership, the

ministry has stabilized and is well positioned for growth. The ministry in Freeport, Bahamas, under the leadership of Pastor Hanna, has shown great passion and zeal to reach their community.

INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS TEAM - Mission teams visited Guyana, Jamaica, and the Turks & Caicos Islands. Their commitment and dedication is making a positive Kingdom difference.

THE FOCUS ON JESUS HOUR - In 2012, we moved into Radio Ministry, and without a doubt this has been a successful venture in sharing the gospel. We added FM station WCNO 89.9, which has a wide coverage area. We will continue to monitor the effectiveness of this ministry and will strive to identify ways to be more effective in presenting the Gospel.

FOCUS MEDIA - In addition to the restructuring that was undertaken in 2012, we have added a Canon Image press. This machine replaces an older machine, improves the quality of our publication, minimizes the manpower needed to complete projects as well as reduces the cost of operating Focus Media. Our lease payment on the old machines has started to expire and over the next few years we will be able to reduce the significant payments being made for printing equipment.

CONVERSIONS - Heaven rejoices over just one sinner that repents and is converted. With thankful hearts we are happy to report that 6 persons were reclaimed, 56 persons were baptized in the name of Jesus, and 61 persons received the Holy Ghost.

WEDDINGS - I officiated at four wedding ceremonies: Bro. Robert and Sis Chantal, Bro. Lenny and Sis. Jennifer, Bro. Ryan and Sis. Sabrina and Bro. Gary and Sis. Sojini.

BABY DEDICATIONS - With the assistance of the Elders, we dedicated 31 babies to the Lord Jesus Christ.



DEATHS - Funeral services were held for our loved ones who the Lord called home. They included Baby Samuel Anthony Jackson, Sis. Phyllis Smith, Sis. Dollia Cliett, Sis Gloria Chin-Francis, and Bro. Gilmore Kidd.

We have not been able to start mid-week services due to work schedules.




CONCLUSION

entecostal Tabernacle of Kissimmee was started in January of 2012 with a handful of saints living in the Kissimmee and Poinciana They envisioned a strong, vibrant Pentecostal congregation in the area that would bring the gospel to the community and serve its needs. Through God's providential hand, they were able to rent a building on one of the main streets in Kissimmee, and started having service with about 10 people. They were also able to secure sound equipment, chairs, and many other church supplies from another congregation which was no longer meeting. This group has faithfully met, worshiping and praying together, and the congregation on a Sunday has grown to about 40 people.

Toward the end of 2013 and the beginning of 2014, several significant events took place in the life of the Kissimmee congregation including the transition of pastoral leadership on an interim basis to Elder Winston Miller, the incorporation with Pentecostal Tabernacle International, and the execution of the inaugural Right Hand of Fellowship membership service, where the church's first official members were accepted. In the morning service, a record number of 59 people were in attendance and 27 persons were welcomed as members.

GOALS FOR 2014

- Establish a Pastoral Staff, appointing ministry leaders for Edification, Evangelism, and Fellowship (which will include ministries such as Hospitality and Member Care).
- Begin 20 home small group meetings and/or home Bible studies.
- Establish and schedule Sunday School classes for appropriate age groups.
- Establish periodic prayer walks in nearby neighborhoods and shopping plazas.
- Recruit 200 consistent prayer partners in other churches and in the community with which

We are confident that no matter what happens "the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it!"

e are thankful for God's blessings for the past year. Although very challenging, we are comforted in knowing that "He that begun a good work...is able to perform it until the day of Jesus Christ". We are aware that nothing good comes easy but know that we can still smile in the storm.

One of the major difficulties is consistency as we have a very transient congregation and more have been forced to migrate due to the slow economy in the Islands. We were not successful in reaching all of our targeted goals, but we have been able to continue to carry the Gospel to the lost and have seen greater maturity among the brethren.
