God's Kingdom Building:Prison Outreach of Delaware

Update from Chaplain Steve Anderson:

Ministry to the incarcerated and addicted is difficult. Any type of Christian leadership is challenging. The Apostle Paul states in II Corinthians 4:8 that, "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair, persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed.' To hear these words coming from the Apostle Paul, who went through so much in his service to Jesus, should inspire perseverance in those of us who lead.

This past month has been particularly difficult both inside the prison and in our Aftercare ministry. All prison chapel services, studies and counseling sessions are moving forward as usual - praise God. Though, they are not without the pressures listed above by Paul. We hold onto the promises of God regardless. I am not at liberty to share the specific conflicts going on in the prison, but I'd be happy to do so in person with any of you who are interested.
