"So you're telling me that if the Nazis repented, they would go to heaven?"

"Yes—that's what I'm saying. That's how serious the grace of God is... and how powerful the blood of Jesus is."

"Okay, I understand."

"But you don't agree?"

"No. That sounds crazy."

"I think we need the love of Jesus to be that crazy. If it's powerful enough to forgive a Nazi, it's powerful enough to forgive me too."

"Yeah, I get it. I just don't agree."

That's how a recent conversation about the gospel went. We landed in the spirit of Ephesians 1:7 "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace..."

I was sitting on the ground floor of the engineering building with a young woman who has attended our Bible study all semester. Two other students were at the table with us. Afterward, one of them said, "I've been a Christian all my life, and I've never thought about grace like that."

This is the long, slow work we are doing at the University of Delaware—reaching students friend by friend for Jesus, and equipping them conversation by conversation to serve Him for life.
