

Lunar New Year is one of the many, many times throughout the year when we see our neighbors engaging in worship of the local deities as well as their ancestors. They will put out snacks, fruit and incense on an offering table and at the end of the celebration, they will eat the snacks and fruit. Some Christian friends recently shared that this worship is often just an outward expression of an empty heart. They said people don't think about what their ancestors want to "eat", but that it is for themselves. Some even go so far as to return the sacrificed items back to the store they came from.
