#### New Year: New You!

Yes, it is that time again...time to make a New Year's resolution. We always say that we won't do that, but openly or secretly we typically do. So, let me help you along your journey as you explore the possible list of resolutions you can make for 2018. How about a new you? I love how Luke opens the book of Acts, "I wrote the first narrative (Book of Luke), Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach until the day He was taken up, after He had given orders through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom He had chosen. After He had suffered, He also presented Himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during 40 days and speaking about the kingdom of God." (Acts 1:1-3, HCSB) Luke again reminds his readers that the account that he was writing wasn't just an idea or story, but actual historical events that he felt compelled to research and document. Luke refers to this as "convincing proofs" not mere conjecture or superstition.

Do you think Luke had this all figured out and documented in a day? Of course not. This endeavor took time, resources, and effort. But as he continued to unbiasedly search for truth, he uncovered layer after layer of the undeniable gospel of Jesus Christ. Praise God that Luke took the time to do research, carefully examine the evidence, and record his findings so that we too may benefit from it. Now it is our turn to continue to research and examine the evidence so we can give our lives fully to Christ and advance the kingdom of God.

Ravi Zacharias says, "Man rejects God not because of intellectual demands nor scarcity of evidence, but a moral resistance that refuses to admit his need for God." In other words, there is plenty of reasonable and logical evidence for God, but many choose to ignore it so they can live however they want. So this New Year I challenge you, study God's Word and examine the evidence. Let the power of the "living and active" Word change not only how you think, but also who you are. Then, as a disciple of Jesus, go make more disciples!
