Offering Help, Receiving Help



The Early Church Example

I have been blessed lately by a bible study challenging me to consider putting scripture within its context. This includes how the books following Acts relate to the historical record found in Acts as well as many other cultural and regional considerations. Through this study, a theme continually popped up when it came to the early church: unity. Within this unity, we see the early church offering each other help and receiving help from one another. The study is quick to point out that the responsibility of the church helping each other must come from all the parts of the church body, not just from the leadership of the church.

What Have We Created?

The example of the early church demonstrates that there was an attitude of joy when it came to the help and fellowship that was shared among the first believers. A model did not exist where the apostles were expected to meet every need and be involved in every activity or difficulty. In fact, just the opposite is true according to Acts chapter 6. Seven men separate from the apostles were assigned the task of solving a dispute and address the needs so that the apostles could continue to teach what they learned from Jesus. Also, the early church met in their homes daily to fellowship and "break bread" with one another. It would be a stretch to think that the apostles were in every home of the 3,000+ new believers. Somehow, in our "Western" way of thinking, we have created a different model.

Reclaiming the Biblical Model

So how did the early church have all things in common, experience joy, and grow? I believe it came down to this: every believer counted because everyone was contributing to the health of the church body. It worked because they walked through life together. They didn't expect the apostles to satisfy every need because everyone was united in effort and purpose. When they received help or spent time together, no matter who was there, it counted as "the church" being involved. I believe that they took to heart Jesus' words that were repeated by Paul in Acts 20:35, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." And yet, it is important to "receive" well. What I mean by that is, don't negate the blessing of someone reaching out to you just because they don't hold a position in the church. Instead, let's reclaim the biblical model of growing together in unity. That way, a dying world will see that there's truly something special going on here and want to be a part of Jesus' redeeming love!


Upcoming Stuff
