Mobilizing Our Vision of Faith & Freedom with Our Voices and Votes in 2016!

"Oh freedom, oh freedom, oh freedom over me. And before I'd be a slave I'll be buried in my grave. And go home to my Lord and be free."

This post-Civil War African-American freedom song, often associated with the 20th century Civil Rights Movement in the United States, provides a helpful historical lens for understanding why elections have been important to all African-American churches. Voting and other methods of engaging our public voices have been important in our quest to obtain freedom from social and legal racism in the U.S. while relying on the biblical promise of a transcendent freedom in the afterlife.

Dr. Albert Raboteau at Princeton University points out the following concerning religious formation of African-American churches: "These Christians appropriated Christianity on their own terms despite what they were told or not told by their slave holders and U.S. law. African slaves experienced dissonance between their dignified African identities and the disempowering and undignified messaging of White colonizers and missionaries."

This kind of social marginalization and oppression of people of African descent, and the acceptance of the biblical narrative of struggle, deliverance, hope, and faith have provoked and encouraged the faith of people of African descent. Such faith has informed their vision and mission to fight for a dignified and equitable quality of life as evidence of earthly freedom.

Historically, African-Americans were prevented from establishing independent institutional churches in the U.S. Dr. Milton C. Sernett of Syracuse University points out that from the early 1600s until the early 1800s, the

so-called "black codes" prevented people of African descent from organizing places of worship. It was not until 1816 that the first independent Protestant denomination founded by people of African descent was organized worldwide - the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME) - which celebrates its bicentennial this year. The AME church and successive independent Protestant denominations founded by people of African descent have had the mission of ministering to the social, spiritual, physical development of people of African descent and all people.

This mission of ministering has led to the historic embrace of voting as a means for moving toward freedom. Yet U.S. laws have consistently prevented and hindered voting by people of African descent. The 15th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution made it legal for African-American men to vote. African-American women did not obtain this right until 1920 with other women in the USA. However, in both cases, Jim Crow laws, put in place in many Southern states, like literacy tests and poll taxes, made it

difficult for them to fully exercise their right to vote. And even today, African -Americans still face obstacles. Three years ago, the Supreme Court



struck down the heart of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, freeing nine states, mostly in the South, of the requirement that they seek federal approval before changing their election laws.

As a result, numerous states have imposed strict voter ID laws that civil rights groups say unfairly target African-Americans and other minorities. African-American churches have always been a beacon of hope, activism, and support.

In this election cycle, our involvement will be vital more than ever, once again fulfilling our larger vision of faith and freedom through the witnessing of voting. Many African American churches, including our Convention, have joined the Freedom Sunday Coalition for a wider expression of unity in urging people of African descent to vote. The Freedom Sunday Coalition is a national non-partisan faith-based civic engagement coalition of African- American faith leaders dedicated to year-round voter registration, education and mobilization on issues of importance to communities of color.

The coalition is comprised of leaders from denominations such as the (African Methodist Episcopal Church, African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, Full Gospel Baptist Church, Fellowship International, National Baptist Convention, USA, National Baptist Convention of America, Church of God In Christ, **Progressive National Baptist Convention and** independent organizational partners such as PICO National Network, African-American Ministers Leadership Council, Samuel Dewitt Proctor Conference, Inc. the Global Alliance Interfaith Network and the Global United Fellowship. These leaders represent a network of over 13 million people of faith across the United States. In 2014 the coalition mobilized over 3500 churches, touched over 1 million faith voters in the six weeks leading up to the Mid-Term Elections and had an impact in increasing African-American voter turnout by 1-2% in Kentucky and Louisiana.



The vision of the Freedom Sunday Coalition is to create an empowered, engaged, active voice for justice within our political system that will speak to the needs of African-American communities. We must reclaim our power and mobilize massive turnout of the African-American vote in local and national elections to determine who will best represent a vision of empowered, healthy, whole communities.

Given our Convention's role in the Coalition, We are encouraged to organize two primary Freedom Sundays — September 25th, 2016 and November 6th, 2016 — when churches around the country will preach and teach about voting rights, voter mobilization, registration, and encourage civic participation. Bread for the World is a partner with most of the partners mentioned in the Coalition and joins our Convention in the promotion of the Freedom Sundays to mobilize our critical voice and votes, at all levels, on November 8th! As we preach, teach and mobilize please urge the candidates to have hunger and poverty on their platforms. We believe we can end hunger and further reduce poverty if we have the right leadership at every level of the political process. Now it is up to us to make sure this happens!



Ecclesiastical Endorser Report

To President Jerry Young, The Board Members and Staff of The National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., Chairman Griffin, Home Mission Board, Executive Secretary, Gilbert Pickett, Sr., and The Home Mission Board Members.

My first six (6) months as the Ecclesiastical Endorser has been an exciting and very rewarding ministry experience. I have had a total of 377 inquiries from February 4, 2016 to August 1, 2016. The inquiries have ranged from new ecclesiastical endorsements to renewals of current endorsements or some questions about the endorsement process. I have provided assistance and administrative support for over 65 new and old endorsement requests. I have also received a verbal commitment from 195 chaplains who have committed to attend our professional training at the 2017 NBC, USA, Inc. which, as you know, will be held in St. Louis, MO.

At the Congress in June, we had 95 chaplains who registered for the Professional Chaplains Institute and an additional 17 chaplains who registered but did not participate. Our first training session was a tremendous success and very rewarding which was highlighted with the distribution of the very first Chaplain Handbook. Everyone that registered and participated in the session received the Chaplain Handbook upon entering the class and the response was overwhelming.

Our primary objectives for the week were:

- to provide all of our chaplains, bi-vocational pastors and pastors with the tools and skillset to assist them in the identification of potential problems with addictions and mental health issues;
- to provide clinical and spiritual insight into the emotional and physical suffering that threatens the

- wellness of the chapel, church, the family system, and community;
- to provide basic skills and working knowledge necessary for identifying and assessing mental health challenges, substance abuse, addictions, depression, guilt, grief, shame and trauma;
- to assist the participants in the identification of potential harmful personal issues that may potentially strengthen or harm their ministry;
- to provide clinical, biblical, and spiritual guidelines to enable a theological understanding of pastoral care and counseling in a variety of settings with skill, competence and caring;
- to provide instruction on the Twelve Steps and their biblical comparison for use in the chapel, church and group settings;
- to provide an overview of the new vision for the chaplains, bi-vocational pastors and chaplains, ministers and others who are endorsed by the NBC, USA, Inc. to grasp the vision of our National President as they provide ministry in a variety of professional settings around the globe; and
- to impress upon every participant the need to always remain vigilant in their scope of duties when addressing and assessing clients, soldiers, sailors and airmen who need pastoral care and emotional support. I understand that what we say and do just might prevent a possible suicide. Our goal is to find ways to prevent and stop the veterans and others from self-harm and self-destruction.

Finally, my personal goals and objectives for class participants are to assist every person, regardless of their ministry and/or station to think pastorally from a biblical, theological and behavioral science perspective.

My hope is to move forward from a potential position of annihilation to amalgamation. We can achieve this goal by realizing and understanding the situation, use listening skills, coupled with reflective questions and learn the value in working cooperatively and collaboratively.




Regional Coordinator Report
