

National Domestic Warfare: Avoiding a New 9/11

Our nation is engaged in domestic terrorism, better known as civil war. The problem, as reported by congressional representatives, there is no law that names Domestic Terrorism for what it is as there is a law for International Terrorism.

Once our political leadership passes a law or designates certain acts of violence as Domestic Terrorism, our leaders will unleash the full arsenal of its resources to combat the hatred that serves as the source of domestic terrorism against all people, but especially against People of Color.

As I write, our nation has gone from 9/11 to 9/30. In Dayton, Ohio, nine people died in thirty seconds while many others were hospitalized from a terrorist attack on innocent people. This tragic 9/30 will become our new 9/11 if we Americans and churches in particular, do not take seriously the need for recalibration of our preaching, teaching and community engagement.

Evidence of a new 9/11 is the thirty-two previous mass shootings and counting! Mess murder in El Paso, Texas, preceded the mass murder in Dayton. How many race/ethnicity-based killings are needed before we admit domestic terrorism is a present reality? At a recent Pennsylvania Baptist Congress of Christian Education, I had the privilege of instructing pastors and ministers. The subject matter was the interrelationship between Church and Family. Included in my instruction was the need for a Biblical Theology of the Family, one that treats the family holistically, and adds Community resources to the Church and Family development.

In addition, an important part of instruction was reclaiming African American Historical Memory for empowering family self-esteem. I used the children's question recorded in Joshua 4:1-18, "What meaneth these stones?" as the default setting for highlighting God's divine intervention on behalf of God's covenant community. Joshua 4 is thick with meaning for recapturing or reclaiming HIStory in the midst of our history as servants and soldiers in God's Kingdom.

A third vitally important unit of instruction had to do with how small churches can become vibrant and more relevant churches. This can be done by Inter-church, interdenominational cooperation. If we do the work of developing relationships with our neighborhood churches in a spirit of mutual enrichment and racial reconciliation, we will achieve far more than what we have satisfied ourselves with over the last ten to twenty years.

It was quite evident from our discussion that both church and national leadership have been guilty of insanity--doing the same things that no longer work, expecting different results, if we just stay the current course. As long as we do not deal with the major causes of mass murder, namely, the National Rifle Association, Mental Health resource deficits, lack of enforcement of current laws, failure to address gun manufacturers' gun purchase violations and the lack of political will on the part of the U. S. Senate in not bringing bills that can impact peoples' lives to the floor for discussion and vote.

We must learn from Congress that hoping, praying and moral-sounding resolutions of condemnation will not work without intentional action. Faith plus work and prayer plus action will earn us the results for which we pray.

What's true for our national family is true for our church family. We must work smarter rather than harder, recalibrate our curricula, consult family experts, partner with social service organizations, form alliances or partnerships with other communities of Christian faith, etc. for transformational change.

Mission Includes a Call to Sustainable Dignified Work!

While many celebrate the 4th of July,
Juneteenth is also known as Independence Day for
many people of African descent who are children of
enslaved African peoples. It commemorates the day
when many formerly enslaved African peoples learned
of their freedom as a result of President Abraham
Lincoln signing the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863.
Two years later, Congress adopted the Thirteenth
Amendment abolishing slavery.

The proclamation ended approximately 250 years of unpaid labor by African descendants in the United States. This unpaid labor produced wealth for those who enslaved them. The National Humanities Center states: "unpaid labor was at the heart of slavery in America. Enslaved people usually worked from early in the morning until late at night. Women often returned to work shortly after giving birth, sometimes running from the fields during the day to feed their infants. On large plantations or farms, it was common for children to come under the care of one enslaved woman who was designated to feed and watch over them during the day while their parents worked."

The recent devotional in "Lament and Hope" is a reminder of how policies have not always benefited African Americans. The Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 was a significant piece of the New Deal legislation that established a national minimum wage, maximum work, and prohibited most employment of children under 16.

According to Bread research, during that time period, 60 percent of African American women were working as domestic workers and 41 percent of African American men were still working as farmworkers.

Others primarily worked as servers, shoe shiners, Pullman porters—considered tip-based professions. Thus, most African Americans were not able to access the benefits of the Act of 1938, widening further the racial hunger, income, and wealth gaps.

Sadly, the labor and racial inequities persist today. As recently as 2018, the Economic Policy Institute reported that black unemployment was at least twice as high as white unemployment at the national level. The same report found that in 14 states and in the District of Columbia, African American unemployment rates exceeded white unemployment rates by a ratio of 2-to-1 or higher.

Advocacy matters today! The historic and stubborn structural vestiges of the enslavement period, colonialism, and many years of racial inequities contribute today to the lack of full work with benefits and living wages for all peoples of African descent nationally and globally.

May this Quad-Centennial year help us to renew our commitment to advocate for work with dignity with and for all people (James 5:1-6) so that all may be fed. You can help Bread for the World do this by e-mailing your comments about how this can be done to awalker-smith@bread.org.

This is a brief report concerning those impacted by the Southwest Region storms of 2017 and 2018 that the Home Mission Board gave support to.




