

Brief History

The Nineteenth Street Baptist Church (NSBC) has served Washington, DC, its suburbs and communities around the world for 176 years. The church is located in a residential community and is served by a major bus line. Members travel from around the Washington, DC metropolitan area to attend worship services on Sundays and to participate in various ministries throughout the week.

The church was founded as The First Colored Church of Washington almost a quarter of century prior to the Emancipation Proclamation by a group of dedicated Baptist ministers and laypersons on August 29, 1839. This group, which included Rev. Jeremiah Moore, Rev. Lewis Richards, Rev. Adam Freeman, Rev. William Parkinson, Charles P. Polk, Cephas Fox, Charles Rogers, John Buchan, Joseph Borrows and Sarah Borrows, undoubtedly envisioned a place where Christians would serve the Lord with gladness, grow spiritually and be able to fellowship with one another.

A committee was authorized to buy Lot 11 in Square 118 on the southwest corner of Nineteenth and I Streets, N.W. There, a house of worship was erected that was to be incorporated as The Baptist Church of Christ in Washington. The church was later incorporated on November 16, 1870, as the Nineteenth Street Baptist Church. The church remained on the corner of 19th and I Streets, N.W. for 135 years until it moved, January 26, 1975, to its present location at 4606 Sixteenth Street, N.W.

During its spiritual and physical growth, the church has had dedicated and dynamic leadership. The ministers to lead NSBC include Rev. Dr. Walter H. Brooks, who served until his death; Rev. Dr. Jerry A. Moore, Jr., who served until his retirement; and most recently Rev. Dr. Derrick Harkins until he was called to serve as a Senior Vice President at Union Theological Seminary.

Profile of NSBC

NSBC is located in the Ward 4 section of Washington DC. Of D.C.'s population of 600,000, about 75,800 reside in Ward 4. About 25 percent of Ward 4 residents are white, 59 percent are black or African American, 19 percent are Hispanic or Latino, 3.9 percent identify as multiracial, 1.6 percent is Asian, and 0.1 percent is Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islanders.

The church is located in a residential community, but is served by a major bus line. Almost two-thirds of the congregation resides within 10 miles or less from the church. These individuals live in Washington, D.C., Montgomery County, MD or Prince George's County, MD.

The present church membership is over 500. Like many predominantly African American congregations, NSBC has an aging population. More than two-thirds of the congregation is over the age of 60 and 77 percent of the membership has been a member for at least 11 years. While half of the church's families have been members for one generation, almost 18 percent of the families have been members for 2 or more generations and 31 percent for three or more generations. Approximately 45 percent of the members are single, 41 percent are married and about 14 percent are widowed.

NSBC's worship services seek to praise God through worship, prayer and the preaching of the Gospel. One service is held each Sunday at 10:00a.m. This traditional style service includes devotional praise, a call to worship, songs of praise, responsive reading, words of welcome, offertory, altar call, the sermon and the invitation to Christian discipleship. The choir, drums, an organ and a keyboard are regularly used during worship and additional instruments on special occasions.

That we will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together, but will uphold the public worship of God, and the ordinances of His house:

That we will not omit closet and family religion at home, nor neglect the great duty of religiously training our children, and those under our care, for the service of Christ, and the enjoyment of heaven:

That we are the light of the world, and salt of the earth, we will seek Divine aid to enable us to deny ungodliness, and every worldly lust, and to walk circumspectly in the world, that we may win the souls of men:

That we will cheerfully contribute of our property, according as God has prospered us, for the maintenance of a faithful and evangelical ministry among us, for the support of the poor, and to spread the Gospel over the earth:

That we will, in all conditions, even till death, strive to live to the glory of Him who has called us out of darkness into His marvellous light.

"And may the God of peace, who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make us perfect in every good work, to do his will, working in us that which is well pleasing in his sight through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory, forever and ever. Amen"

Core Beliefs

- 1. **The Scriptures**: We believe that the Holy Bible is divinely inspired, inerrant and is the guide for Christian living.
- 2. **The Holy Trinity**: We believe the Scriptures teach that there is one, and only one, living and true God, and in that there are three distinct entities, Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost in one being.
- 3. **Salvation**: We believe all men and women are sinners and that by repenting, grace is extended. It is through salvation, a free gift from God that we are saved through faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.
- 4. **Baptism**: We believe the Scriptures teach that Christian baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost. The immersion signifies the forgiveness and cleansing of our sins through the death and resurrection of our Savior.
- 5. **The Lord's Supper**: By communing together and through the sacred use of bread and wine, which represent Christ's body and blood, respectively, we commemorate the dying love of Christ together.
- 6. Sanctification: We believe the Scriptures teach that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness. As a progressive work, sanctification is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means especially the word of God, self-examination, selfdenial, watchfulness, and prayer.
- 7. **The World to Come**: We believe the Scriptures teach that the end of the world is approaching. At the last day, Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave for final retribution. Then, a solemn separation will take place and the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy; and that this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness.
