Sis. Brenda G. Lott, General Secretary, presented the program for the week and gave highlights of the minutes from the last annual meeting in Orlando, Florida – September 5 – 9, 2011. Motion by Sis. # <u>Presentation – "Developing A Youth Ministry for the Twenty-first Century", Rev. W. J. Lawson, Pastor, Cornerstone Baptist Church, Atlanta, GA.</u>

Pastor Lawson began his presentation by asking for input on the decline of youth in our churches today. He then gave statistics and emphasized the method must change but not the message. A beautiful informative hand out was shared with all who had registered. He also emphasized, "If it's not working, why continue to do it?" Young people do not have a visual, spiritual eye for the church today; youth are now born into a technology age. We need to take some time to get to know our children...individuals win trophies, but it takes a team to win the championship". "If you don't love them, you can't lead them." We should use modern day translations of the Bible youth can understand; Children's Bible, Teen Bible, NIV. If we use dialogue they don't understand, we will lose them. Examples of methods for drawing and retaining our youth were shared. Rev. Lawson said, "Success without a successor equals failure." We should always be training someone to take our place. Three important areas for a strong youth program are providing youth with belonging (John 10:28-30), behaving (attention span, diversity in lesson delivery) and believing (Matthew 28:19-20)." In place of evangelism, community outreach through block parties was an effective method in his Church community to reach the youth and their families.

## <u>Presentation: "Ministry to Children in Crisis" by Mrs. Frieda L. Gilyard, Shiloh Baptist Church, Columbus, Ohio.</u>

Mrs. Gilyard is also Faith Community Task Force Director for the Columbus Coalition Against Family Violence. Too many young people have to "pay the price for adult decisions and for the mistakes adults in their world make." She shared abuse in our homes today, the effect of texting on relating to our youth, youth alcohol abuse and results of cocaine addicted parents on the safety and well being of our youth. "A teenage girl may be taking care of all the household duties and seeing after younger siblings and is too tired to do her homework each night. One of the most effective ways of ministering to our youth is to not be afraid to share our own downfalls and shortcomings...let them know that the you they see now is not who you have always been. "Letting a child know what you have come through makes a huge difference in a hurting child's life because it gives the child hope that he or she will be able to make it through, too."

#### "Annual Report" National Director Dr. Marian J. Hockenhull

Director Hockenhull recognized leadership and gave special thanks to Sis. Carolyn Heard and the Georgia Host Committee. She thanked everyone for their service and faithfulness.

Highlights of her report: Director Hockenhull is thankful for the Convention last year in Orlando, FL and being able to attend the Regionals this year. She thanked all for their prayers, calls, cards, flowers, resolutions (over 1,000 received) and other expressions of love and kindness during the home going of her husband, Pastor F. O. Hockenhull. Director Hockenhull reported further on her stewardship and re- emphasized the theme: "Solidarity with the Savior through Worship". She asked that we learn to follow protocol; remember we are to train our youth to take our place. Worship is not entertainment. Worship is all about God and who He is; Praise is about thanking God for what He has done for us. Worship is not about us (Psalms 24, Psalms 95, 96, Psalms 100). We were encouraged to attend the Regionals or host one next year; Director Hockenhull related the difficulties in the Northeast Region this year.

Director Hockenhull was presented a Love Offering and also special expressions of love from the Regional Directors. Rev. James Brown brought the closing meditation from Psalms 150. Worship – are we where God placed, positioned us?
