You Need A Covering Romans 10: 1-10 Pastor L. B. West, D.R.S.

Some people think they have to wait for Sunday morning to be in Church in order to be saved. Others think that it's a must that they allow Pastor or a Preacher to lead them into salvation. If that's what

people believe then they are clearly operating in the realm of Churchology and not Christology.

Churchology is that which has been homosapien driven. As Paul tells the Church at Rome, some people have a zeal of God, but it's not according to knowledge. A zeal meaning they have an excitement about God; they have an intense enthusiasm for God; but it is not according to true knowledge. Unfortunately, they are (exactly what verse 3 says), ignorant of God's righteousness and they have gone about establishing their own righteousness, which means that they have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God. Verse 4 says, For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth.

Brothers and sisters what Paul is espousing and what I've just said to every one under the sound of my voice is, "YOU NEED A COVERING." (Example) Paul said in verse 1, "My heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved." He was saying, my hearts desire for Israel is that they attain a covering. Yea, my desire for everybody under the sound of my voice is that you actually get yourself covered.

Now somebody just may be asking themselves, why do I need covering? Well

you need covering because in this life some rain will fall; I didn't say it might fall, I said in your life some rain will fall. When the rain begins to fall and the contrary winds begin to blow - you're better off if you have your covering. Before this year is out some rain is going to fall in your life; I said, it's going to rain and you need your covering. At some point in this year, somebody is going to lie on you, it's going to rain. At some point in this year somebody is going to try to block your promotion and your upward mobility at

somebody is going to try to block your promotion and your upward mobility at work; it's going to rain. At some point this year somebody will try your patience by attempting to get on your next to last nerve, it's going to rain. At some point this year, your spouse or your significant other just might let you down, it's going to rain. At some point this year, so called friends just might turn their backs on you, it's going to rain. At some point this year - your money just might start acting funny, it's going to rain. And when it rains, you want to make certain you are well protected. When it rains you want to make certain you are covered.

That's what the umbrella does; it protects you from the rain and it protects you from the elements being blown by strong contrary winds. This umbrella symbolically represents our ever protecting God. You see Psalm 46:1 says, God is our refuge; a refuge is a shelter; a protection; a covering.

Over 2000 years ago, our God sent His children protection to be used - not just as needed - but to be used everyday and in every way.

Some people make the magnanimous error, the magnanimous mistake of only attempting to use their covering - just as they think they need it. But some days we need protection from the rain; other days we need protection from the wind, and yet other days we need protection from the blistering rays of the s.u.n.

You need a covering and according to our text today, you can be covered by God's preordained covering for mankind, "The Word." The Word will be your protection, The Word will be your guide. The Word will cover you and protect you from the potential devastations of the nuances of life. The Word will protect you from all elements that come against your life. No weapon formed against you shall prosper. The text says, the Word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth and in thy heart that is the Word of faith, which we preach.

Now beloved you can have the Word near you and still not allow the Word to cover you. (Example) It is necessary even when the Word is as close as being in your mouth that you open the Word and gather underneath The Word. (Example) Many, many people have the Word close to them but unfortunately they don't open the Word and they don't gather themselves underneath the Word for the Word to cover them. Listen beloved, establishing a covering is actually a two-step process: 1. Confessing with your mouth The Lord Jesus; 2. And Believing in your heart that God actually raised Jesus from the dead - the text says, thou shall be saved.

Confessing is the easy part because quite frankly, anybody can confess with their mouth; but the second part is where the rubber meets the road - will you allow yourself to actually believe in your heart that God raised Jesus from the dead. That's the tough part. Believing in your heart is literally a form and function of having submitted to "The God" who has provided the Covering for all of our lives on a daily basis anyway. God wants us to be saved. God wants His children to be with Him in the place of salvation; that place called Paradise - that place called Heaven. God desires that we all have not just a covering, but He desires that we have His Covering. Therefore, when we confess with our mouths the Lord Jesus, and we believe in our hearts that God actually raised Jesus from the dead, and the Blood of Jesus actually becomes our Covering.

As we gather under "The Blood" COVERING of Jesus, the purity of His blood covers a multitude of sins. It covers lying; it covers deception; it covers cheating; it covers stealing; it covers sexual immoralities; it covers hatred; it covers strife; it covers heresies; it covers idolatry; it covers drunkeness and all other sins. Not only does the Blood of Jesus become our Covering, but as I said earlier, God is our refuge, our very present help in times of trouble. Therefore we are covered by the Blood of Jesus.

The covering is a pretty good place to be. Obed Edom, in the Old Testament actually had the Arch of the Covenant in his house. The Arch represented the blessing and covering presence of God. Obed-Edom's house was truly blessed - not because it deserved the blessings, but purely because the presence of God was in that place. His presence provided a covering for God's favor to be represented, respected, and revered.

If you want your house blessed, you must get under the authority and covering of God. I want you to get this picture in your minds, all the men, who are head of your households, get home and take your umbrella and put your spouse and your children, even your pet animals under your umbrella; ensure that they are covered. Gather your whole family and put them under the covering of God. Ladies, if you don't have a man right now, don't fret about it - take your own umbrella and hold it over your own head. Or if you have a man and he is not holding his umbrella up for you and your children to gather under, then you grab your own umbrella and tell that man, if you're not going to cover me then since my relationship with God is in good working order I'll just cover myself and my children. Step away from any man who is not willing to cover you and your children and seek ye first the Kingdom of God and all His righteousness, and the promise is that He will add all these things unto you.

Beloved, you need a covering and you can get your covering today. You don't have to wait until tomorrow for tomorrow is not promised to you; you don't have to wait until next Sunday, for none of us knows what next Sunday will bring. But what we do know is - we need a covering. And to receive that covering people who are not saved need to confess that they are sinners; they need to confess that they would like for that help to come from the Lord Jesus Christ.

I would lead a person into the security of the Body of Christ by saying: If you're ready just repeat these words after me: ETERNAL GOD OUR FATHER, I REALIZE I AM A SINNER. I REALIZE I NEED HELP. I **REALIZE I NEED A SAVIOR. I ASK** THAT YOU WOULD FORGIVE ME FOR ALL THE SINS I'VE COMMITTED, AND I HUMBLY ASK THAT THE LORD JESUS CHRIST COME INTO MY LIFE. I WILLINGLY RECEIVE THE LORD JESUS CHRIST AS MY LORD AND MY SAVIOR. THANK YOU FOR GRANTING THIS NEEDED REQUEST IN THE NAME OF JESUS. AMEN!

The Leadership Council for Healthy Communities Encourages Healthy Breathing

The Leadership Council for Healthy Communities has health coordinators in many DC churches, including our church. Ms. Jackie Smith is our health coordinator and will be promoting and encouraging healthy behaviors, particularly in terms of respiratory health.

What is the Leadership Council for Healthy Community (LCHC)?

The LCHC promotes healthy behaviors. To do this, it works with the faith community, the medical community, health ministry networks, and community partners. The Council is comprised of dedicated and committed faith leaders and workers from various backgrounds who take information and share it with their congregation and community members. According to their website, "The Leadership Council for Healthy Communities (LCHC) is an outgrowth of the work of a group of prominent clergy leaders in the District of Columbia, who came together to organize and address health disparities within minority communities" (http://lchcnetwork.org/our-partnerships/).

Each year, there has been a different health focus with primary attention paid to HIV and AIDS. This season, the focus is on Respiratory Wellness in some Wards of the city, including the Ward in which Mount Airy resides.

The Respiratory Wellness program will entail preventive and self-management education, screenings, and, in some instances, according to the LCHC, linkageto-care for respiratory related diseases. The program is managed in collaboration with Med Star Washington Hospital Center (http://lchcnetwork.org/our-partnerships).

Why does respiratory health matter?

According to the **American Respiratory Care**, "Respiratory Care is the health care discipline that specializes in the promotion of optimum cardiopulmonary function and health and wellness. Respiratory Therapists employ scientific principles to identify, treat and prevent acute or chronic dysfunction of the cardiopulmonary system." So your breathing helps your heart to function and the respiratory care you take is also the care that translates to the betterment of your heart system. Many may not know what exactly are respiratory problems? These are illnesses that many experience daily, such as asthma, acute bronchitis, and even chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (**COPD**) includes chronic bronchitis, emphysema, and lung disease that makes it hard to breathe.

The American Lung Association says that COPD is the third leading cause of death in the United States. More than 11 million people have been diagnosed with COPD, but an estimated 24 million may have the disease without even knowing it. COPD causes serious long-term disability and early death. At this time there is no cure, and the number of people dying from COPD is growing. (http://www.lung.org/lung-healthand-diseases/lung-diseaselookup/copd/learn-about-copd/how-seriousis-copd.html) There are ways in which COPD can leave people feeling weakened, and even depressed, and anxious; being not able to breathe is a life and death issue.

- You feel breathless
- You avoid activities that make you feel breathless.
- You do less.
- Your muscles weaken.
- You get more breathless,
- You feel depressed.

COPD is increasingly common, but the good news is COPD is often preventable and treatable.

The LCHC Health Coordinator Will Give Presentations

The LCHC Health Coordinator will work on ways to educate us, the congregation, and the community, on better respiratory health and ways to manage, prevent and/ or treat respiratory infections, such as COPD.

The LCHC Coordinator, Ms. Jackie Smith, will have more information on healthy breathing and ways to feel and better. Stay tuned for these important health presentations!

RECIPE: Crunchy Top Pound Cake

You will need: 6 eggs, 1 cup (2 sticks) butter, 3 cups sugar, 3 cups all-purpose

flour, **1** cup whipping cream (heavy cream), and **1** teaspoon vanilla.

Grease and flour a tube pan.

Set out eggs and butter to allow them to be at room temperature.

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar, adding 1 egg at a time; beating for one minute after each addition.

Sift flour and add to mixture alternately with whipping cream.

Mix until fully incorporated. Then stir in vanilla.

Pour mixture into prepared tube pan and place in a cold oven.

Turn oven to 300 degrees and bake for 80-90 minutes, until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

Cool completely before removing from pan.
