- By the way, we do not see this food drive as the best way to serve our community, but as a way to create relationships in the community that will open doors to other ministry opportunities. We not only want to help solve the material poverty that is so easy to identify – such as the lack of food in this case. We know that, just like for us, there is much relational, emotional, and spiritual poverty in our community. And those other types of poverty can only be addressed through deep relationships – that is where we think God is leading us. And this food drive is one of the initial steps to help us get there.

4. **Bible Reading Plans – How’s it going?** At the beginning of the calendar year, many of us started a Bible Reading Plan with the goal to either read through the entire Bible in one year, or to have more consistent time reading God’s words to us. - **Prayer MT forming!** God has been working in the hearts of many members over the past year or more, leading us toward the formation of a specific ministry team (MT) whose purpose is to cultivate a deeper culture of prayer at Cornerstone, both corporately and individually. - **Living H2O Guatemala Vision Update – “Focusing Cornerstone’s Ministry in Guatemala”:**
 - As we continue to develop our relationships in Guatemala through Children’s HopeChest, the Living H2O team has prayerfully considered, what is the best way to “Help without Hurting?” After further assessing our vision and goals for this aspect of the H2O ministry, a mission and vision trip, and session insight and guidance, **we have refined our orphan ministry in Guatemala to My Special Treasure (MST) only**, rather than supporting two orphanages.
 - In discerning how to best help without hurting both the children and leadership in MST and Nuevo Reto (NR), and our own church members, **it was determined that dividing our efforts, commitments and focus between two orphanages would more likely hurt than help both homes, and possibly hurt us. Thus, we will now focus solely on the spiritual, physical, relational, and financial needs of MST (Caesar and Carol, and the 11 girls currently there).** We know this is hard for those sponsoring children in NR, but we will phase out this relationship over several months. There were many factors which directed this decision, but **the primary factor was a vision and optimism for a relationship with MST.** Our hope is that this relationship will glorify our Lord and bring great joy and hope to a home filled with lovely young ladies needing the love of Christ.
 - **The needs at MST are great. Our goal is to increase our level of financial and relational support by adding additional families to the sponsorship program, support capital, educational and vocational programs, and meet more medical and dental needs of the girls. Thank you for your continued support as we grow this orphan care ministry.** Please contact H2O with questions.

Hymn of the Month: "Lead On, O King Eternal"

The hymn "Lead On, O King Eternal" was written by a young graduating seminarian, Ernest W. Shurtleff, in 1887. Shurtleff was born in Boston, Massachusetts on April 4, 1862. His classmates at Andover Theological Seminary, recognizing the poetic ability of their colleague, asked him to write a hymn which they might all sing together for their commencement service. Shurtleff responded with this excellent text. At the time of his graduation he had already published two volumes of verse and throughout his later ministry wrote a number of additional hymns. This is his one hymn text, however, which has endured the passing of time.

Apostles' Creed, Date: 4th Century

Of Christendom's many creeds, the best known and most used are the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed. Both creeds state what Christians believe to be true without explaining how they are true.

Though the apostles did not write it, the Apostles' Creed developed as a way for the early church to hand on the basic structure of biblical faith. Roman Christians used a question-and-answer form of the creed to prepare converts who wanted to be baptized and join the church.

Some words and phrases in the Apostles Creed may cause confusion to us today. The word "catholic" here denotes a universal church, or one common Church that unites all believers. Also, to say that Christ "descended into hell" doesn't speak of an actual trip to hell, but speaks of His experience on the cross and being separated from the Father. As we encourage one another with these truths, we join with Christians around the globe and throughout the ages.
