JANUARY 2,012

During this month, the girls began a new school year. We also had to pay for their registration, buy books, notebooks, uniforms and shoes. The budget was quite high, but we thank God because this year was the first in which we had the resources to cover everything for their education that the girls needed and to be able to cover it at the beginning of the year. Thanks be to God and your donations.



March 2,012

During this month we had a nice visit from Steve Brandt and Doug Leepa who brought us many greetings from each one of you and gave each of the girls the gifts and letters from their sponsors. They also shared with us some very special moments and we had the opportunity to watch a movie at theater, at the only shopping center in Chimaltenango. For many girls it was their first experience of being in a movie theater and they were very excited to see a big screen and the sensational sound system. It was truly special to see the happiness in each of our girl's as they were able to enjoy an outing that they are not used to doing.

Later we had a time to with Steve and Doug about the needs of the home and of the girls. It was a time of blessing and hope for us, as directors and parents of girls who daily face very difficult situations, but with the help of God we keep moving forward.



During this month the girls had their assessments in the first semester in school and thanks to God, the majority went with acceptable grades. The girls who excelled and ended up in the top three places for the best grades were:

The girls are blessed to be able to receive beautician classes. The teacher is from our church and God placed it in her heart to support the girls by teaching them all the procedures in this course. The teacher is doing so voluntarily and is not charging anything.

During this month the girls began to practice cutting hair by cutting the hair of children from various schools in the capital, although they were always under the supervision of the teacher. Even though they were the first haircuts that the girls had done, they did a very nice job and are very excited.

Also the girls have begun to receive English classes from missionary, Victoria Marquette Bernal who is visiting us on Mondays and Fridays to teach the girls and is a blessing to all of us. The only thing is that we would like to support her with the cost of fuel for her car. She is a very friendly person and very patient to teach English to the girls. She is really a great help to us all.



How we feel as Directors

Our joys:

For us it is a very happy time when a new girl enters My Special Treasure, which is not very frequent due to the limiting structure and resources, but when God does allow the opportunity to receive a girl is of much joy to us because we know that from the moment she enters My Special Treasure there is a purpose from for her life.

Another one of our joys is when we see the girls appreciate and care for the blessings that God sends to them, which we are able to see in the positive changes that they show in our home, school and church.

Our sorrows:

Our greatest sadness is when we lose a daughter because we love all of the girls that are with us as if they were our own real daughters. Sometimes, they leave because the judge orders them to go to another institution where they can be with their other siblings.

It is very sad and we often feel frustrated when a girl is not interested in changing her bad behavior and is carried away by her emotions of anger and rebellion. It is very painful for us when she doesn't appreciate the help that she is given and decides to leave our home. It is very sad and many times we mourn for them because we know that her future will not be good.

Spiritual Area:

- Every day we teach girls about the love of Christ through prayer, Bible study, participation in Christian services that are focused in seeking God and worshiping Him.
- The girls are also taught and trained for works of service in the local church and within the home so that God's Word is reproduced and expanded in the lives of many children.
- We have special times to discern the gifts, talents and strengths that God has given each of the adolescent girls and to provide opportunities so that they can develop their gifts in the church and within the home, but something that they all have in common is that they like to sing praises of worship to God.

Our concerns:

Since last year we have had problems with finances. It's been difficult to gather the money needed for rent, electricity and for the telephone bill. We have not had the funds to cover the medical aspects of the girls. One of the priorities that we have is their need to receive dental care because several of them have problems with their teeth. We were also unable to buy clothes or shoes for the girls. Lastly, we have not been able to pay for the professional services that the law requires institutions to have, such as social workers, psychologists, accountants and teachers.

In order to pay rent and the electric and phone bills we have had to ask for permission to use some of the money designated for education services. On other occasions we have had to borrow money to cover these payments so that we would not get behind. It is difficult to have to think about what we are going to do each month as the due dates get closer and many times we end up being two months behind at a time.

Our thanks:

- We thank God, the brothers and sisters of Hope Chest and Cornerstone Church for the support and love that they are providing to each of the girls.

• Thank you for joining us in our vision to support the girls, to see them as young ladies, graduated with a career in college. Also in the vision that they would be good disciples of Jesus Christ so that one day they can help other girls who are in the same situation that they were and so that they can also help their own family.

Prayer requests:

- Additional income to help with our financial situation.
- A larger bus.

• Buy a bigger house or land to build a home where we can start building little by little the areas that we need for girls, such as a computer lab, an area to do their homework and a room for their devotional times that include praise to God and the teaching of his word, it could also be used for English classes.

• That God would send the teachers and professionals that we need so support the girls in specific areas. People who are called, have good attitudes and are a witness before God so that they may be a blessing to the girls and be a support for us in the spiritual area of discipleship and when necessary, they can pray and minister to the girls.

• We ask God to bless and reward the brothers and sisters of Cornerstone Church and of Hope Chest greatly for all of the love and support that they give to girls.

- Last month we wrote to you about senseless target killings taking place in our city, we have not seen any change so far. This unpleasant, heartbreaking dance of death goes on in our city streets. On average 8 to 10 people are losing their life and countless families have become victims of such crimes. We do know that nothing lasts forever not even our troubles. Like they say, cookie today, crumbs tomorrow. It seems life is very cheap without any value. Even if people shut their doors and sit in their own homes, yet trouble will fall from the skies. How can this be? What can be done to help hurting people? How to bring comfort & hope in the real sense of this word? How to help people who have met tragedy face to face? Life is not one long process of getting tired. Right! Let us go on our knees and talk to our Father to seek His divine wisdom. Please keep praying for change of hearts of people here. Pray that the Father will open the hearts & minds of people to come to know the Prince of Peace. To Know Jesus is to know peace, No Jesus, No peace is reality.

- **Face Book:** Over 4,500 young people have made a commitment to get training & share their faith with others around them. This group is living in different cities. On Saturday April 28, 2012 we had our first meeting with those who live in our own city. We had 97 people come for this event. As you see, the work load is increasing and we need your prayers to reach out to this group of people. Please pray for the Lord's wisdom for us as we share the vision of reaching out to others in the country. Pray that the lost of this land will hear the voice of the Good Shepherd and will follow Him. Please pray that people will grow in their understanding of the Scriptures.

- Our **Good Friday** and **Easter services** were real blessings to us all. Jonah preached in three different locations on Good Friday. The first service was at 9:30 a.m. the second service from 12:00 – 4:30 p.m. and the third service was at 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. It was one long day of teaching & preaching. In the afternoon service, we had over 2000 people sitting under a tent with temperatures over 100 degree.

- We rejoice with those whose hearts & minds were open that day to hear about His Love on the Cross, for His people. We wish we can give you more information on these events but we rather not share more as we are not sure of the E-mail security at this end. Jennifer and I were deeply moved as to how the Lord uses these events to bring glory to His Name. Thank you for your prayers for these events. Your prayers are being answered. Above all we would like to produce teaching /training audio, video CD or DVD. Hymn of the Month: "Lead On, O King Eternal"

The hymn "Lead On, O King Eternal" was written by a young graduating seminarian, Ernest W. Shurtleff, in 1887. Shurtleff was born in Boston, Massachusetts on April 4, 1862. His classmates at Andover Theological Seminary, recognizing the poetic ability of their colleague, asked him to write a hymn which they might all sing together for their commencement service. Shurtleff responded with this excellent text. At the time of his graduation he had already published two volumes of verse and throughout his later ministry wrote a number of additional hymns. This is his one hymn text, however, which has endured the passing of time.

Apostles' Creed, Date: 4th Century

Of Christendom's many creeds, the best known and most used are the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed. Both creeds state what Christians believe to be true without explaining how they are true.

Though the apostles did not write it, the Apostles' Creed developed as a way for the early church to hand on the basic structure of biblical faith. Roman Christians used a question-and-answer form of the creed to prepare converts who wanted to be baptized and join the church.

Some words and phrases in the Apostles Creed may cause confusion to us today. The word "catholic" here denotes a universal church, or one common Church that unites all believers. Also, to say that Christ "descended into hell" doesn't speak of an actual trip to hell, but speaks of His experience on the cross and being separated from the Father. As we encourage one another with these truths, we join with Christians around the globe and throughout the ages.
