4. **Summer Lunch & Learn Outreach Opportunity, Jun 18 – Aug 9:** **Have you wondered how you and your family could minister together to work with the “poor” in our community?** God might be providing that opportunity for you. How?

The Judy Center and St. Mary’s DSS are running a summer program called “Lunch and Learn”. The goal is to alleviate hunger AND encourage learning throughout the summer for children of low income families. Lunch will be served free for all kids 18 and below, and then educational activities/games will be provided. There are two schools used for the program: Lexington Park Elementary (11am-12:30pm) and G.W. Carver Elementary (12-1:30pm).

The parents of the children in the program usually just sit around outside the schools, waiting for their kids to finish so they can go home.

St. Mary’s DSS and the Judy Center have **invited Cornerstone to participate** directly with the program via volunteers that will work with the kids. But they are also aware of our TMT ministry’s efforts to provide development training to lower-resourced families in our community, and have asked us to provide classes for the parents of the children in the Lunch & Learn program. We need to determine the exact need, but expect to select a specific day of the week, then participate each week on that day... or maybe two days a week.

How can you get involved? There are 4 ways:

1. Your **kids** can participate in the program (lunch and activities/games), providing good role models and friendship to other kids in the program.
2. The Cornerstone TMT members are planning to hold a forum with the parents to find out their felt needs, and what classes might be helpful. **Cornerstone teachers will then provide classes to those parents** who would like training in budgeting/financial literacy and/or parenting.
3. **Cornerstone adults can simply befriend the parents.** Material poverty is many times accompanied by relational poverty. Just providing a listening ear can show that you care and can be a big encouragement for those in poverty.
4. If you would like to work with the kids, you can **volunteer** to work directly in the program.



Cornerstone TMT has been looking for an opportunity where low income families gather, and this program is creating that opportunity. This is our first year, so it will be a learning year and we will need to be flexible. But even if we start to create relationships and can start to teach some classes, those relationships and classes can continue, and could possibly develop into mentoring relationships.

5. **Guatemala Short Term Mission Trip Update:** Cornerstone will be sending ambassadors to the “My Special Treasure” orphanage in Chimaltenango, Guatemala, on **June 21-27**. The team has been preparing and will continue to prepare – planning activities and examining their hearts. **With just 2 weeks remaining, only 25% of the necessary funds have been raised** (\$1684 of \$8800). Be in prayer for the team, and for My Special Treasure – Cesar, Carol, their kids, and the girls – that God will provide the necessary funds and training, and prepare a great week of ministry to all involved.

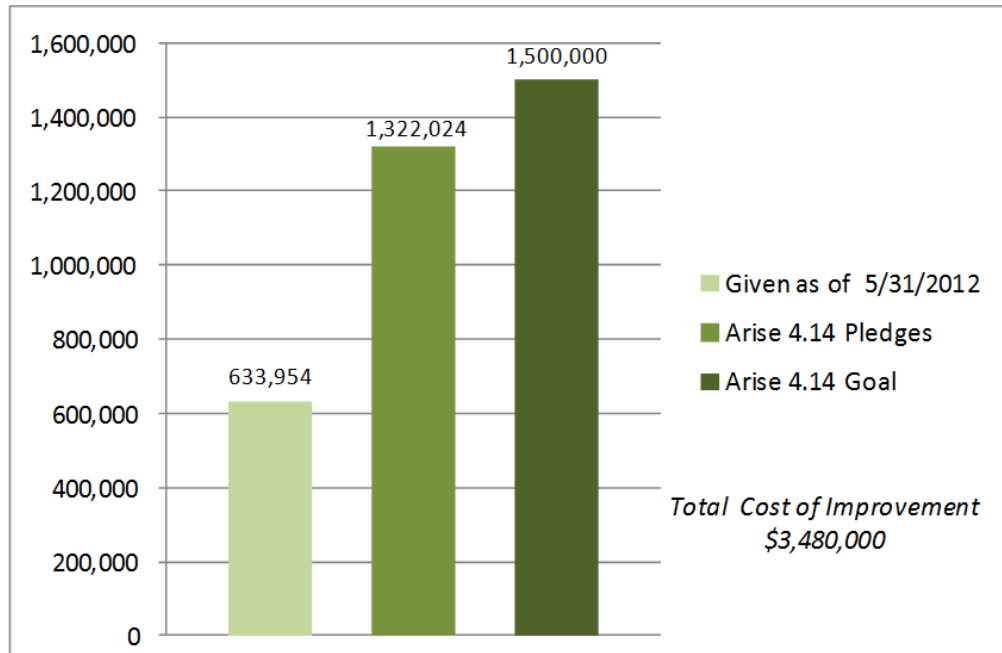
“Aslan is on the move”:

MISSIONARY UPDATES:

- **Japan Update:**
 1. Japan needs the gospel desperately. Japan is now the number #1, largest unreached people group in the world (UPG), according to the Joshua Project (see <http://www.joshuaproject.net>). We are also #1 in “hikikomori syndrome” (those who shut down emotionally and refuse to leave their room or their house), #1 in sexless marriages (for young couples, up to couples in their forties), and #1 in declining population due to critically low birthrate. Depression is rampant, and we are #2 in suicide rates among the industrialized countries. These are not things any country wants to excel in. Pray for a new and powerful working of the Spirit. Pray for more harvest laborers, missionary and Japanese.
 2. Rev. Daisuke Kimura has been chosen as the first PCJ church planter to move to the north to plant a church and eventually a presbytery in the disaster hit region. Please pray for God’s leading and provision in this huge new undertaking. Pray for more Japanese church planters



for this project. Pray for our MTW Japan partnership with them, and for career as well as short-term missionaries to partner with Daisuke.

- Continue to pray for our recovery mercy ministry and outreach in Ishinomaki City devastated by the tsunami (a pre tsunami city of 160,000 people). We are working in two areas there. Pray also for Sendai City (population 1.4 million). Churches must also be planted there to be a part of reaching Tohoku since it is the major city of the northern region,.

Hymn of the Month: "Come Ye Sinners"

The words of "Come Ye Sinners" were written by Joseph Hart, a British preacher, and published in 1759. The tune is called "Restoration". It's an Appalachian folk tune published by William Walker in The Southern Harmony and Musical Companion in 1835. William Walker used the shaped note system to compile these songs, and this song is still often sung by shaped note singing groups, usually with the words to "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" for the verses and the words from "Come Ye Sinners" for the refrain.
