- 1. SUNDAY MORNING: PROMOTION INTO NEW BUILDING: Our Promotion Sunday Ceremony will be this Sunday, Sept 9th, at 9:30am.** During this ceremony, we will recognize our Sunday School teachers for the past year and the year to come, then provide a special report from the Children's Ministry Team about what God has been doing in Sunday School this past year. Then we will announce the new classes, introduce each child, and all the children and youth will march from the Sanctuary to their new classrooms. After the kids go, Walt will discuss our discipleship programs, including describing the 4 Adult Sunday Morning classes that will be available. DO NOT enter the new facility right away – we will be gathering in the Sanctuary first at 9:30am and then entering as Sunday School class groups. All doors will be locked to the new facility, so if you forget and run into a locked door, remember to come to the Sanctuary! (Coffee will be provided for adults, so no need to make a run to DD or Starbucks!)

Note: Nursery will be provided for the 8am service and for 0-3 years old at 9:30am – come to the Sanctuary building and you will see signs and/or be directed on where to go.

2. NEW NURSERIES – NEW PROCEDURES: As we move into the new facility this Sunday, we will be using the new nurseries!! **If you have children ages 0-4** or serve in our nurseries, please read the details of the new procedures below in this message from our Nursery Ministry Team Lead, Elizabeth Buckingham:

Hi Parents!

As many of you know, this Sunday, September 9th, will be the Grand Opening of the new building! With the new building, comes new, beautiful nurseries! On Sunday, there will be signs directing you to the new location of the nurseries. Also, there will be signs located outside the doors to assist you.

New Nurseries

There will be 3 rooms in the new building used for the nurseries:

1. Infant Nursery

2. Walkers/2's Nursery

-This will be the single nursery at **8:00** (Infants through 4 Years Old), and **9:30** (Infants to 2 Years Old)

3. 3 & 4 Year Old Nursery

Mothering Room/Cry Room

The former infant nursery will become a Mothering Room for nursing moms and sleeping babies. For those moms that will use the sleeping babies room, there will be a TV to watch the service while you supervise your baby. The former 3 & 4 year old nursery will serve as a cry room. There will also be a TV in that room to watch the service.

NEW Nursery clip safety system

This system is meant to add an extra layer of security to keep our little ones safe in our church. When you sign-in your child, you will receive a numbered clip, and the corresponding clip will be put on your child and diaper bag (Infants & Walkers/2's) if applicable. ****A parent MUST bring their matching clip back in order to pick up their child.**** Please value the importance of returning your clip **FIRST**, before picking up your child.

Optional cell phone/text alert

There will be an optional section on the sign-in sheets for parents to receive a text if their child needs them. A nursery worker will still come into the service to get a parent if that section is not filled out.

Dropping off/picking up children

Please help us keep our children safe and nurseries organized by refraining from entering the nursery. The nursery workers will be there to welcome your child and help you with sign-in/out procedures.

Thank you for your patience and understanding during this transition into the new building!

- **Soup Kitchen Serving Team:** Last year over 16,700 meals were served at St. Mary's Caring Soup Kitchen, a 20% increase over previous years, and it is expected to be a greater number this year. Therefore, **we are creating a more robust structure for our volunteer force.** Multiple teams of at least 4 people need to be established, preferably 6 people each. Each team would consist of 1 team leader, 1 cook, and 2-4 helpers. These teams would serve on a rotating basis, but would commit to serving one meal at least 3 times during the year. MINISTRY UPDATES:

- **Integrated Discipleship Plan:**



Are you interested in growing spiritually? Growth happens most when we are in relationships where we are getting disciplined. **What is a Disciple?** In short, a disciple is a follower of Jesus Christ, someone who is increasingly trusting Jesus Christ and living their life in response to his mercy and grace. One of the key points of Cornerstone's mission is "Discipleship" – making and maturing disciples.

This year we have many discipleship options for different styles and levels of commitment. Below is a list that describes the different options. If you are interested in one or any of these, please click here and let us know so we can get you more information. We want you to have the information you need to make a wise decision... one that could affect your life greatly this year.

Christian Education Classes (a.k.a. "Sunday School Classes")

On Sunday mornings between 9:30 and 10:30, Cornerstone offers classes for all ages and multiple classes for adults in order for them to grow in their understanding of the Word of God, the teachings of the Bible, Christian Living, and serving as Christian Leaders. This form of discipleship focuses on information transfer from a teacher to multiple students. A list of this semester's courses will be available towards the end of August. Small Groups

Throughout the week and throughout St. Mary's County, there are a wide variety of Cornerstone Small Groups. Small groups consist of between 6 and 12 men and women. These are a great way to grow in Christian community, in applying God's Word to daily living, and in loving our neighbors. This form of discipleship involves group interaction in a smaller setting (many times in homes) and is therefore more relationship-based. Journey Groups

If you are serious about discipleship, Journey Groups may be for you. JG's are single gender life-on-life discipleship groups that meet weekly for a year on various nights and mornings. Their purpose is to transfer the spiritual life from one person to another in the context of small groups of people (4-8) such that people grow as disciples from unbelief to belief; from belief to maturity; from maturity to ministry multiplication. Each meeting requires about two and a half hours of preparation. Journey Groups begin each September and involve a 9 month commitment. If you are interested in being in a Journey Group, let us know and we will strive to connect you with a group that would be a good fit. Most small groups will start the week of **Sept 16**. Micro Groups (Smaller than Small Groups) [New this year.]

These are single gender prayer and accountability groups of no more than four who gather two to three times per month to share their lives with each other, invite the others to hold them accountable as Christ's disciples, and to pray for one another. These provide more flexibility for busy schedules, but they can also be integrated into Small Groups, Ministry Teams, Education Classes, and Journey Groups. Shoulder 2 Shoulder (Women's Mentoring)

This is the WMT's women's mentoring/encouragement matching program, called Shoulder 2 Shoulder. This is designed to match up women 1-1 for a specified time period (1 year) in order to grow together in faith, in love, and in maturity. This is by no means a mandatory program to replace any mentoring that is already occurring within Journey Groups or other organic relationships. Rather, it is a program designed to serve as a means for connecting women across generations or spiritual maturity levels who may not have other opportunities to meet one another.

- **“The Big Gathering” – an Evening of Discipleship, Fellowship, and Ministry at**

Cornerstone: After getting your inputs and continuing to pray about this, we have decided to move forward with "The Big Gathering" at **5:30-7:30pm** on Sunday evenings, **starting September 16th**. Thanks to everyone who provided inputs. Your inputs have helped generate ideas for ways to 1) make our initial proposal better, and 2) create opportunities at other times during the week to meet additional needs.

- First, instead of calling it "Family Discipleship Night", we are planning to call it "The Big Gathering", because singles are very much included! And there could be ministry beyond just discipleship happening. (If you have an idea for a better name, please let us know. "Unity Night"?)
- Second, we are changing the time to 5:30-7:30pm so that parents can get kids home earlier on a school night.
- Third, we will plan to have small groups and other activities available on other nights of the week so that those working/ministering on Sunday nights will have encouragement and learning opportunities. If this is you, please consider joining a "Micro Group" this year. [Click here](#) to read more about Micro Groups.
- Also, Dagan is planning on creating events outside of the Sunday Youth Group meeting that will create environments that are safer for youth to relationally engage with each other and build open, honest, and supportive friendships..., places where discussions can grow deeper and foster growth. Once a group gets beyond 8-12 people, it is hard to create those environments, so the 2 hours that our Youth Group meets on Sunday nights will focus on goals that can be achieved in a larger group setting. Cornerstone's Youth Ministry has many dimensions that extend beyond the once-a-week Youth Group 2 hour meeting... since our youth have MANY dimensions... if you know what I mean.



We know that with change comes loss – we are losing the way we used to do some things that bring us comfort – we know what to expect in those situations and we like them. But we also know that **God has led Cornerstone to be in this place at this time and is leading us forward to grow in ways that we can't even imagine.** Although there is discomfort that is sure to come, we have a

“great cloud of witnesses” that we can read about in Hebrews 11 that show us that God is worthy of our faith and trust, and He promises that the end result is definitely worth the bumps and divots that we experience on the adventure. I know that I’m personally very grateful that I get to travel this journey with all of you, and I thank you for traveling with me and all of us.



“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and **let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith**, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. 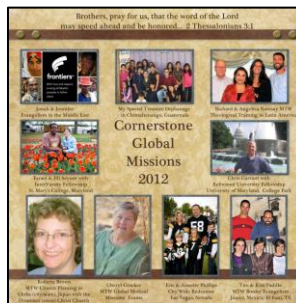
Conclusion:

Worship notes:

Hymn of the Month: "Come Thou Fount"

In his book *My Life and the Story of the Gospel Hymns and of Sacred Songs and Solos*, [Ira Sankey](#) writes:

"First published in 1742 under the title, "Behold the Man," this became one of the most useful of Charles Wesley's numerous hymns. In universal use in English countries, and translated into many languages, it has been the direct instrumentality in the conversion of thousands of souls. It has found expression in the exultant cry on the lips of many a dying saint.

Profession of Faith – Belgic Confession, Article 10 – “Jesus Christ is True and Eternal God”

The Belgic confession's chief author was Guido de Bräs, a preacher of the Reformed churches of the Netherlands. The churches of his country were exposed to terrible persecution by the Roman Catholic government. To protest against this persecution, and to prove to the persecutors that the adherents of the Reformed faith were not rebels - as was laid to their charge -de Bräs prepared this confession in the year 1561. In the following year a copy was sent to King Philip II, together with an address in which the petitioners declared that they were ready to obey the government in all lawful things, but that they would "offer their backs to stripes, their tongues to knives, their mouths to gags, and their whole bodies to the fire," rather than deny the truth expressed in this confession. In 1567, Guido de Bräs fell as one of the many thousands who sealed their faith with their lives. His confessional work has endured for centuries. There are 37 articles in this confession. MINISTRY PLAN FOR CORNERSTONE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Purpose and Vision

At Cornerstone, our purpose is to glorify and enjoy God by growing a loving body of faithful disciples that is reaching Southern Maryland and the world for Christ.

Mission

We accomplish our vision by:

- Worshipping the triune God
- Growing a loving body
- Multiplying mature and equipped disciples
- Reaching Southern Maryland and world for Jesus Christ
- Leading others in Christ's kingdom

Core Values

As a church of Jesus Christ, we are a:

- **Gospel-centered.** The gospel, as revealed in God's Word, is the center of who we are and all that we do. It is the truth that through faith in Jesus Christ alone, all of our guilt, shame and unrighteousness is removed and replaced with all of Jesus' beauty and righteousness. Growth in the Christian life occurs the same way that it began: through believing the gospel.
- **Prayer-inspired.** Prayer is essential to the life of a Christian and to the life of a church. Through prayer we commune with God, express our need and dependence upon, align ourselves with God's work, and become empowered by God's Spirit.
- **Kingdom-driven.** God's kingdom has entered history in the person of Jesus Christ to renew the whole world and reconcile all things to himself. The church is God's principle instrument of making the fullness of his coming kingdom a present reality.
- **Incarnate.** God incarnated himself in the person of Jesus so that the world could be reconciled to God and one another. As a church we model the incarnation in manifesting the love and truth of Jesus Christ to Southern Maryland and wherever we serve.
- **Authentic community.** This is a community where Jesus Christ is experienced in his presence and power, where lives are transformed by the gospel through mutual ministry. In gospel-centered community, people come to know and experience his presence in a way that cannot happen individually. This is a community where it is safe to be broken without fear of condemnation, where there is gospel inspired transparency and accountability, and where there is a fertile context for the Holy Spirit to transform lives.

Our Denomination

Cornerstone is a member of the Presbyterian Church in America, an evangelical and Reformed denomination committed to the Lordship of Christ and the proclamation of the Gospel to the ends of the earth.
