The Top 5 things to think about this week:

1. DO NOT GO INTO THE BALLROOM:

Although it seems like a new form of torture, especially since the basketball hoops are now installed, **we CANNOT go into the Ballroom this week, including this Sunday, Sept 16.** The workers are doing a special cleaning this Friday in preparation for the crew that will paint the lines on the floor next Monday. This is a special type of paint, and if we want it to last as long as possible, we need to ensure the preparation is correct. This means that:

- We cannot go into gym this weekend. We would contaminate the floor.
- After the lines have been painted on Monday, we cannot go on that floor for 2 days - Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Thursday the crew will be adjusting the basketball hoops so they are the correct distance from the out of bounds base line.

Also, the ceiling and windows in the gym are NOT TARGETS. If balls accidentally hit the ceiling (including sprinkler heads and lights) or windows, that is okay. But those should not be targeted. **Please be sure to tell your kids, and help us keep everyone out. Thanks in advance for your help.**

2. NEW NURSERIES – UPDATED PROCEDURES:

Thanks for your patience as we are learning how to best use our nurseries in the new building. **If you have children ages 0-4** or serve in our nurseries, please read the details of the new procedures below in this message from our Nursery Ministry Team Lead, Elizabeth Buckingham. I've added the highlighted "NOTES" this week:

Hi Parents!

As many of you know, this Sunday, September 9th, will be the Grand Opening of the new building! With the new building, comes new, beautiful nurseries! On Sunday, there will be signs directing you to the new location of the nurseries. Also, there will be signs located outside the doors to assist you.

New Nurseries

There will be 3 rooms in the new building used for the nurseries:

1. Infant Nursery

- This is used:
 - i. 10:45 for Infants
- **NOTE:** If your child is less than 2 and not walking, and you want them in the nursery during Sunday School hour (9:30-10:30) **AND** the 2nd Worship Service (10:45-12:15), then **you will need to pick them up at 10:30** and move them to this Infant Nursery. Sorry for the inconvenience.

2. Walkers/2's Nursery

- This will be the single nursery at 8:00 (Infants through 4 Years Old), and 9:30 (Infants to 2 Years Old)
- This is used:
 - i. 8:00 for EVERYONE – Infants thru 4 Years Old
 - ii. 9:30 for the LITTLES – Infants thru 2 years Old (room is divided)

iii. 10:45 for MIDDLES – Walkers thru 2 years Old

3. 3 & 4 Year Old Nursery

- This is used:
 - i. 10:45 for 3 and 4 Year Olds
- **NOTE:** If your child is 4 years old, and you want them in the nursery during Sunday School hour (9:30-10:30) **AND** the 2nd Worship Service (10:45-12:15), then **you will need to pick them up at 10:30** and move them to this 3-4 yr old Nursery. Sorry for the inconvenience.



Mothing Room and a Training/Cry Room

The former infant nursery (just outside the Sanctuary) will become a Mothering Room for nursing moms and sleeping babies. For those moms that will use the sleeping babies room, there will be a TV to watch the service while you supervise your baby. The former 3 & 4 year old nursery (outside the Sanctuary next to the Men's Restroom – now a "Conference Room") will serve as a training/cry room for those little ones having a hard day. There will also be a TV in that room to watch the service.

NEW Nursery clip safety system

This system is meant to add an extra layer of security to keep our little ones safe in our church. When you sign-in your child, you will receive a numbered clip, and the corresponding clip will be put on your child and diaper bag (Infants & Walkers/2's) if applicable. **A parent MUST bring their matching clip back in order to pick up their child.** Please value the importance of returning your clip FIRST, before picking up your child.

Optional cell phone/text alert

There will be an optional section on the sign-in sheets for parents to receive a text if their child needs them. A nursery worker will still come into the service to get a parent if that section is not filled out.

Dropping off/picking up children

Please help us keep our children safe and nurseries organized by refraining from entering the nursery. The nursery workers will be there to welcome your child and help you with sign-in/out procedures.

MINISTRY UPDATES:

- **New Facilities Ministry Team:** We are forming a new ministry team under the Deacons to help keep our facilities working smoothly. The responsibilities of the Facilities Ministry Team (FMT) include oversight and maintenance of our current and new facility. This includes outdoor and

indoor maintenance and upkeep, supervision of the kitchen, and management of the computers and networks.

"Landscapers Needed. If you are interested in landscaping we could use your talent on the Landscape Committee. We need to establish a landscape plan for the new church building. - **It's time to roll up our sleeves - Encourage Hope Day:**

Three Oaks Center has put together an **Encourage Hope Day**. This is a great way for Cornerstone members to get down in the trenches and serve the community in a tangible way. You can really serve and love the community like Jesus does.

Encourage Hope Day is on **September 29th from 8am-4pm (you definitely don't have to be there the whole day)**. It takes place in the Missouri Avenue neighborhood across from the Lexington Park Volunteer Fire Station (which is next to the Lex Park Library).

This neighborhood is one of the poorest in the county-many residents are on food stamps and other government assistance programs. There is a lot of sadness in the neighborhood; it is covered in trash, there are plenty of broken down/abandoned homes, dealing and using drugs, are rampant in the neighborhood, and many kids are child protective service cases, which means that they have been neglected, abused, etc.

Encourage Hope is a day for the residents to come out and clean-up their neighborhood and for the community to come and support them in this effort. I cannot stress how important it is for this neighborhood to have some **hope** and for the residents to have a clean neighborhood where they enjoy and feel more comfortable living.

It is a day where we can come in and love this community of people, learn their stories, eat with them, and support them in this effort.

We can come together as the body and really be like Jesus to this hurting community (and build some trust too!).

- *Set-up Crew-Arrive at 7AM to help set-up for the day.
- ***Break Down Crew-Start to organize the ending of the day and break down all activities.
- *Power Washing-power wash houses that signed up for the service.
- **Mulch-spread mulch for neighbors who signed up for the service.
- **Flowers-plant flowers for neighbors who signed up for the service.



- **Grass Cutting/Blower-cut and trim grass for neighbors who signed up for the service.
- ***Clean-Up Crew-walk around the neighborhood and pick up trash (there is a ton!)
- *Security Detail-Keep tabs on all the "borrowed" items and Keep the day peaceful.
- *Food-Serving, setting up, keeping things properly stocked, etc; pick up and deliver food items if necessary.
- *Entertainment-Keep times of when each entertainment act should start and finish.

Worship notes:

Hymn of the Month: "Come Thou Fount"

In his book *My Life and the Story of the Gospel Hymns and of Sacred Songs and Solos*, [Ira Sankey](#) writes:

"First published in 1742 under the title, "Behold the Man," this became one of the most useful of Charles Wesley's numerous hymns. In universal use in English countries, and translated into many languages, it has been the direct instrumentality in the conversion of thousands of souls. It has found expression in the exultant cry on the lips of many a dying saint.

Profession of Faith – Belgic Confession, Article 10 – "Jesus Christ is True and Eternal God"

The Belgic confession's chief author was Guido de Bräs, a preacher of the Reformed churches of the Netherlands. The churches of his country were exposed to terrible persecution by the Roman Catholic government. To protest against this persecution, and to prove to the persecutors that the adherents of the Reformed faith were not rebels - as was laid to their charge -de Bräs prepared this confession in the year 1561. In the following year a copy was sent to King Philip II, together with an address in which the petitioners declared that they were ready to obey the government in all lawful things, but that they would "offer their backs to stripes, their tongues to knives, their mouths to gags, and their whole bodies to the fire," rather than deny the truth expressed in this confession. In 1567, Guido de Bräs fell as one of the many thousands who sealed their faith with their lives. His confessional work has endured for centuries. There are 37 articles in this confession. This is a community where it is safe to be broken without fear of condemnation, where there is gospel inspired transparency and accountability, and where there is a fertile context for the Holy Spirit to transform lives.

Christian Education Classes

On Sunday mornings between 9:30 and 10:30, Cornerstone offers classes for all ages. CASKET empty:

God's story of redemption through time

Did you know that there is one overarching story in the Bible? Most Christians know a few Bible stories, but don't know that they fit into one big story, taking place in numerous lands, with different cultures, over thousands of years. What is that story? In a word, it's "Redemption." This is the story of God loving, creating, and saving his rebel children through the Messiah. So how do you get a handle on all of the individual events, timelines, characters, relationships, and sub-stories? We will be using a study and learning tool called "CASKET EMPTY" as a framework to make the big story of the Bible clear. CASKET is an acronym for the story of the Old Testament (Creation, Abraham, Sinai, Kings, Exile, Temple) and EMPTY for the New Testament (Expectations, Messiah, Pentecost, Teachings, Yet-to-Come). The Story doesn't stop on the pages of scripture, but continues today. We will use this group to understand not only the unity of God's story in scripture, but also its relevance to the story God is writing in you. We will spend time sharing our stories with each other, enjoying refreshments together, and finding opportunities to connect our stories outside of Sunday morning through fellowship and service.
