The Top 5 things to think about this week:

1. DAY OF PRAYER FOR UPCOMING ELECTIONS

On **Friday, Oct. 26**, the Cornerstone Prayer Ministry Team (PMT) will be sponsoring a Day of Prayer for the Upcoming Elections, from **6 am until 9 pm** that day. On that day, many of us will be praying (and fasting as the Lord leads) throughout the day, **in designated time-slots**, for our Nation, our State, our counties & communities. The Day of Prayer will culminate with an on-site time of **corporate prayer in the Hospitality Room (Rms. 119 & 120) from 7-9pm**. We would love for you to attend, but whether or not you can attend that evening, please pray with us during the day & into the evening on the 26th. This is a time for us to:

- confess our sins and hardness of heart individually, and corporately as a people, a society, indeed as a Nation;
- confess how we have turned from God's revealed truths and biblical values to the point that almost everyone now does whatever seems right in his/her own eyes;
- confess that our local churches & congregations have failed to be salt & light in the world, but all too often are preoccupied with and largely absorbed by a godless culture;
- ask for forgiveness -- individually, and for our Nation, our State, our communities;
- humbly ask for God's grace that He would not give us the leaders & government that we truly deserve;
- rather, that He would give us national & local leaders who are can discern between good & evil, that acknowledge the Almighty, and that have principals & values rooted in biblical truth;
- that He would do a mighty work to turn the hearts Americans (including ourselves) towards Him and the good works He intends for us to do among the people.

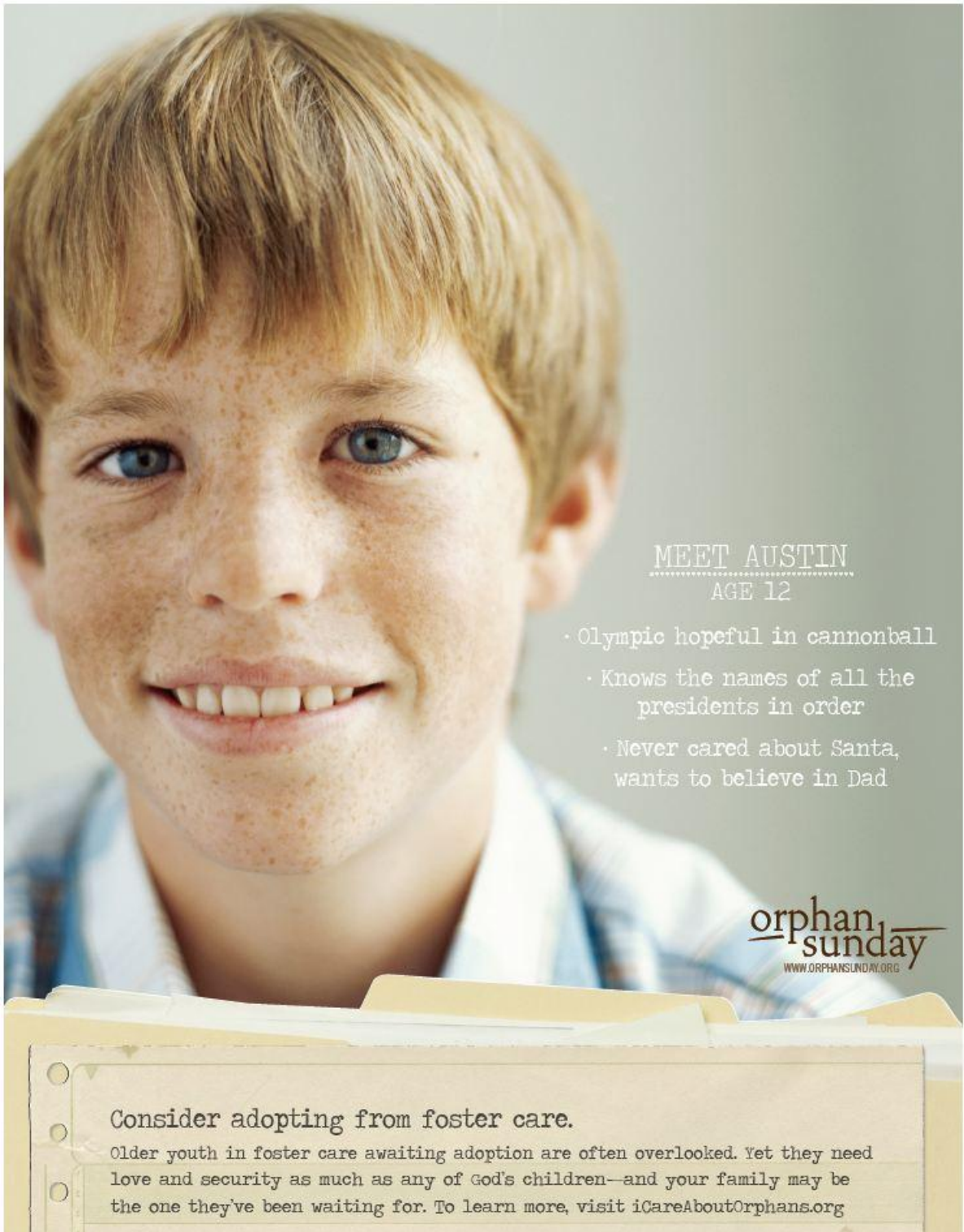

God has blessed Cornerstone richly with our beautiful new facility, as well as some initial furnishings. We were blessed to acquire some used office equipment at great prices –i.e. conference room chairs & dry erase boards. Those items, combined with the reuse of our old items plus a few new items, have equipped our classrooms and hospitality suite and they look great.

So much has been accomplished but there is more to be done, and we are working on the Ballroom now. The Ballroom is being used by MANY different groups of people, but to put it to full use we need tables and chairs (for dinner gatherings, etc.) and we need balls... kick balls, dodge balls, snow balls... lots of balls of all types and sizes for “kids” of all ages and for many different activities that build relationships though fun and competition.


We are providing you the opportunity to participate in this effort to Equip God's House with a “Shower” for the Ballroom. **There will be a list of desired items and estimated costs on a board in the foyer**, and in the Connection next week. This is the “registry” for the Ballroom. Simply put a check in the collection plate and annotate “Ballroom” in the remarks field with the amount designated for this effort. **You may specify “Sports Equip” or “Tables & Chairs”** if you have a preference, and even the name of a specific item. 5. OUR GIRLS IN GUATEMALA NEED SPONSOR FAMILIES

Over the past 3 years, Cornerstone's relationship with the “My Special Treasure” orphanage in Guatemala has improved more and more. We have continued to be impressed with the continued selfless service that the directors, Carol and Cesar, give to the orphaned girls that they have taken into their home. We have been amazed over and over with the genuine love and care that each of the girls have for each other, in spite of most of their troubled backgrounds. In fact, many other organizations that visit many orphanages all around Guatemala City say the same thing: “My Special Treasure (MST) really is a **very special** place!”



As we have seen the quality care and the positive results of that care, **we have become more and more confident that supporting MST is an excellent investment of God's resources**. As we have deepened our relationship with Carol and Cesar, they have opened up to us more about their needs. We see a great opportunity to make a significant impact in this home and in the lives of each of these girls, and after praying about this, feel that God is leading in the direction of investing more deeply at MST. With a small amount of giving, we can see large returns – both finances AND relationships can impact the lives of these girls in a very meaningful way.



To make a deeper investment in MST, we have allocated funds from the Cornerstone budget, but **the biggest way that Cornerstone can grow our support is through sponsorship.** We are looking for additional sponsors for each girl, so that each girl will have 3 sponsor families. Each family will give \$50 each month, AND write an email or letter each month, AND pray often for their girl. The girls will write back and very much appreciate their sponsors. We have seen how much they value the sponsors when we've visited – often pictures are posted next to their beds. You will even have an opportunity to visit the orphanage in person and spend time with your sponsored child!

We are working with Children's Hopechest to support MST. Hopechest's model of sponsorship is excellent, focusing on creating relationships between sponsors and the orphans, as well as between the orphanage and the church. The finances given thru sponsorship go to provide for basic needs, and also for spiritual discipleship from a Children's Hopechest employee. - We hope that this provides more opportunity for you and your family to get involved in discipleship, fellowship, and serving.

MISSIONARY UPDATES:

- **Japan Update – Overall Japan Information:**

1. Japan needs the gospel desperately. Japan is now the number #1, largest unreached people group in the world (according to the Joshua Project), #1 in “hikikomori syndrome” (those who shut down emotionally and refuse to leave their room or their house), #1 in sexless marriages (for young couples, up to couples in their forties), and #1 in declining population due to critically low birthrate. Depression is rampant, and we are #2 in suicide rates among the industrialized countries. Pray for a new and powerful working of the Spirit. Pray for more harvest laborers, missionary and Japanese.
2. Rev. Daisuke Kimura has been chosen as the first PCJ church planter to move to the north to plant a church and eventually a presbytery in the disaster hit region. Please pray for God’s leading and provision in this huge new undertaking. Pray for more Japanese church planters for this project. Pray for our MTW Japan partnership with them, and for career as well as short-term missionaries to partner with Daisuke.
3. Continue to pray for our recovery mercy ministry and outreach in Ishinomaki City devastated by the tsunami (a pre tsunami city of 160,000 people). We are working in two areas there. Pray also for church growth in neighboring Sendai City (population 1.4 million, a major city of the northern region).
4. Tokyo / Chiba Team Members – (This is just for Roberta, our missionary in Japan. If you want to see the entire newsletter from MTW Japan, contact the Cornerstone Missions Committee.)
 - a. Roberta Brown (English Outreach Ministry, Oyumino Church, long term)
 1. Praise God that I have been allowed to return to Japan under a probable 3 year term (instead of 4) and will arrive on 10/3. Pray for the logistics of settling in.
 2. Pray that I may re-establish relationships and continually have a focus on deepening them for the glory of Christ’s name.



Announcements:

- **WANT TO USE THE BALLROOM OR A CLASSROOM?** There is a new process:

In order to be good stewards of the great facility that God has given us, and to make this facility as accessible as possible with accountability, we are putting the following process into place if you want to use the facility.



1. Facility Request: First, fill out a [Facility Request](#). This is available online now, with tools to let you check if the rooms you want are available, and a map of the facility with room numbers. Fill out the online form, and Vicky or I (Dave Perrin) will respond with an email to let you know that you have the room reserved. (Remember that the office is open Monday – Thursday each week.)
 - i. The online form is available via the website – look for the “resources” menu option on the home page, then “Facility Request”... (check it out now – [click here](#))
2. Key Checkout: To get into the building, you will probably need a key. Plan to pick up your key .
3. Opening: There are instructions to assist with lights, heating/AC, etc. Also note if you notice damage or a mess so that you are not held responsible.
4. CLEANING & Closing: There will be a checklist to complete each time the facility is used, and you will need to sign this when you have finished. This will also give us a record of who is using the facility.
 - ii. These checklists are kept on 3 clipboards – one for each major area of the facility: Ballroom, Sanctuary building, and new building Classrooms. These are hung in the Janitor’s closet for the respective building – i.e. the clipboards for the Ballroom and new building Classrooms are in the Janitor’s closet next to the kitchen, and the clipboard for the Sanctuary building is in the Janitor’s closet next to the women’s restroom in the Sanctuary building.
 - iii. Return chairs and equipment (and the clipboards) to the location that you found them, if you have moved them.
5. Key Return: The key should be returned ASAP after the event, unless the key has been assigned for a longer period of time (recurring event, etc).

I know that these steps are common for most facilities, and similar to our unwritten process that we’ve used. But we are formalizing them as the facility has grown and more people will want to use it. We will strive to remain flexible for spontaneous events that pop up – we want the facility to be used for as much ministry as possible. At the same time we want to keep it clean for the next group using it, so be sure to complete and sign the Cleaning & Closing checklist when you are done!

Hymn of the Month – “For All the Saints”

"For All the Saints" is considered to be William W. How's finest hymn text. Originally in eleven stanzas, it was published in Earl Nelson's Hymns for Saints' Days (1864) with the heading, "Saints' Day Hymn. A Cloud of Witnesses. Heb. 12:1." The Psalter Hymnal includes the original stanzas 1-2, 6-8, and 10-11, with modernized pronouns. (Among the stanzas omitted in most hymnals are those that begin "for all the apostles," "for all the evangelists," and "for all the martyrs.")

The text begins with a proclamation of thanksgiving for the saints ("the cloud of witnesses") who confessed Christ and found in him protection and inspiration (st. 1-2). That proclamation is followed by a prayer for Christ's soldiers on earth to be "faithful, true, and bold" (st. 3). At the crux of the text is the confession of a "blest communion" of saints in heaven and on earth (st. 4). Though the holy warfare may be "fierce and long" (st. 5), "all the saints" may take courage from the vision of a victorious church that worships the triune God on that "more glorious day" (st. 6-7).
