The Top 5 things to think about this week:

1. DISASTER RESPONSE TEAM READY? YOU BET, THANKS TO GOD!



Hurricane Sandy loomed over the horizon. Cornerstone's Disaster Response Team was still in its infancy... but it could remain there no longer. Would it grow up in time for the incoming Franken-super-storm of the century? Well, in typical Cornerstone "Just-in-time" fashion, a plan was created and the team assembled. There were many who volunteered, Tony Bowie continued as the Lead (he has been working on the vision and foundations of this for about 6 months), and <u>Twitter</u> was chosen as the primary communication channel (since cell phone text messaging is usually the last to get broken and the first to get fixed).

Only 2 requests for assistance came in, so the team was not overwhelmed to say the least. But Twitter did help communicate power outages as they happened, and provided situational awareness. The second request for help was for trees that had fallen on Cornerstone church property. No damage was done, but due to a quick response from the DR Team, the large pine tree was quickly cut up and removed from the picnic area. This helped the Reformation Party, which used that area the next evening.

Many thanks to the men and women volunteered to be part of this team who will go in after disasters and clean up after physical brokenness and the emotional brokenness that so often happens after families lose so much so traumatically. (Keep in mind that the Disaster Response Team not only needs strong backs for the physical work to be done, but also STRONG HEARTS that will sit and listen and comfort those who have been through trauma – this is the place where I think the church should supply the most workers after a disaster. Of course we know that the real superstar in everything that the Disaster Response Team did was our God, the Creator and Keeper, the one who also created Superstorm Sandy. Without the ideas and inspiration from Him, none of this would have happened. So ALL glory must go to Him. Thanks God!



• OUR GIRLS IN GUATEMALA NEED SPONSOR FAMILIES:

Over the past 3 years, Cornerstone's relationship with the "My Special Treasure" orphanage in Guatemala has improved more and more. We have continued to be impressed with the continued selfless service that the directors, Carol and Cesar, give to the orphaned girls that they have taken into their home. We have been amazed over and over with the genuine love and care that each of the girls have for each other, in spite of most of their troubled backgrounds. In fact, many other organizations that visit many orphanages all around Guatemala City say the same thing: "My Special Treasure (MST) really is a *very special* place!"

As we have seen the quality care and the positive results of that care, we have become more and more confident that supporting MST is an excellent investment of God's resources. As we have deepened our relationship with Carol and Cesar, they have opened up to us more about their needs. We see a great opportunity to make a significant impact in this home and in the lives of each of these girls, and after praying about this, feel that God is leading in the direction of investing more deeply at MST. With a small amount of giving, we can see large returns – both finances AND relationships can impact the lives of these girls in a very meaningful way.























To make a deeper investment in MST, we have allocated funds from the Cornerstone budget, but the biggest way that Cornerstone can grow our support is through sponsorship. We are looking for additional sponsors for each girl, so that each girl will have 3 sponsor families. Each family will give \$50 each month, AND write an email or letter each month, AND pray often for their girl. The girls will write back and very much appreciate their sponsors. We have seen how much they value the sponsors when we've visited – often pictures are posted next to their beds. You will even have an opportunity to visit the orphanage in person and spend time with your sponsored child!

We are working with Children's Hopechest to support MST. Hopechest's model of sponsorship is excellent, focusing on creating relationships between sponsors and the orphans, as well as between the orphanage and the church. To that end, **Hopechest has created a website for MST and Cornerstone:** Click here to see it. Scroll down to read about MST, and click on the tabs at the top to learn more. This website will be developed more in the future, too.

The finances given thru sponsorship go to provide for basic needs, and also for spiritual discipleship from a Children's Hopechest employee. But the biggest benefit to the girls is the relationships that are formed with the sponsors. Won't you please consider joining in a relationship with a special girl in Guatemala? WANT TO USE THE BALLROOM OR A CLASSROOM? There is a new process:

In order to be good stewards of the great facility that God has given us, and to make this facility as accessible as possible with accountability, we are putting the following process into place if you want to use the facility.



- 1. <u>Facility Request</u>: First, fill out a <u>Facility Request</u>. This is available online now, with tools to let you check if the rooms you want are available, and a map of the facility with room numbers. Fill out the online form, and Vicky or I (Dave Perrin) will respond with an email to let you know that you have the room reserved. (Remember that the office is open Monday Thursday each week.)
 - i. The online form is available via the website look for the "resources" menu option on the home page, then "Facility Request"... (check it out now <u>click here</u>)
- 2. <u>Key Checkout</u>: To get into the building, you will probably need a key. Plan to pick up your key .
- 3. <u>Opening:</u> There are instructions to assist with lights, heating/AC, etc. Also note if you notice damage or a mess so that you are not held responsible.
- 4. <u>CLEANING & Closing:</u> There will be a <u>checklist to complete each time the facility is used, and you will need to sign this when you have finished. This will also give us a record of who is using the facility.</u>
 - ii. These checklists are kept on 3 clipboards one for each major area of the facility: Ballroom, Sanctuary building, and new building Classrooms. These are hung in the Janitor's closet for the respective building i.e. the clipboards for the Ballroom and new building Classrooms are in the Janitor's closet next to the kitchen, and the clipboard for the Sanctuary building is in the Janitor's closet next to the women's restroom in the Sanctuary building.
 - iii. Return chairs and equipment (and the clipboards) to the location that you found them, if you have moved them.
- 5. <u>Key Return</u>: The key should be returned ASAP after the event, unless the key has been assigned for a longer period of time (recurring event, etc).

I know that these steps are common for most facilities, and similar to our unwritten process that we've used. But we are formalizing them as the facility has grown and more people will want to use it. We will strive to remain flexible for spontaneous events that pop up – we want the facility to be used for as much ministry as possible. At the same time we want to keep it clean for the next group using it, so be sure to complete and sign the Cleaning & Closing checklist when you are done!

Trinity Hymnal #98 By: Martin Rinkart and Johann Cruger^v



Hymn of the Month – "Now Thank We All Our God"

"Now thank we all our God" is a translation from the German "Nun danket alle Gott", written circa 1636 by Martin Rinkart (1586–1649), and it was translated into English in the 19th Century by Catherine Winkworth.

Martin Rinkart was a Lutheran minister who came to Eilenburg, Saxony at the beginning of the Thirty years war. The walled city of Eilenburg became the refuge for political and military fugitives, but the result was overcrowding, and deadly pestilence and famine. Armies overran it three times. The Rinkart home was a refuge for the victims, even though he was often hard-pressed to provide for his own family. During the height of a severe plague in 1637, Rinkart was the only surviving pastor in Eilenburg, conducting as many as 50 funerals in a day. He performed more than 4000 funerals in that year, including that of his wife.

During this time, Rinkart was a prolific hymn writer. The exact date of "Nun danket alle Gott" is in question, but it is known that it was widely sung by the time the Treaty of Westphalia was signed in 1648.

The tune is the Leuthen Chorale and is attributed to Johann Crüger and written circa 1647, is used in J.S. Bach's cantatas. The now-standard harmonisation was devised by Felix Mendelssohn in 1840 when he adopted the hymn, sung in the now-standard key of F major and with its original German lyrics, as the chorale to his second symphony, known as the Lobgesang or Hymn of Praise. Also, the Late-Romantic German composer Sigfrid Karg-Elert is one of the more recent composers to use this hymn, composing a 'Marche Triomphale' which is a famous piece in the classical pipe organ repertoire. After the Battle of Leuthen in the Seven Years' War, a soldier of the victorious Prussian army started to sing it, and soon all 25,000 joined in the hymn
