The Top 5 things to think about this week:

1. THE CORNERSTONE CHRISTMAS SHOPPE – GIVING GIFTS AND DIGNITY!

This year Cornerstone Church is helping to provide Christmas gifts for 26 of the neediest families from Park Hall Elementary School. **We hope to provide gifts for up to 50 children in the “Cornerstone Christmas Shoppe”**. On Tuesday, December 18th selected PHES staff members will host an invitation-only special “shopping event” for the parents of these children in the Shoppe.



How does this work?

Applying Christian Community Development principles, we have worked with the administration of the school to create a “shoppe” that both empowers the families as they spend their own money (giving them dignity), and meets the needs of the children through very-affordable gifts. The adults from these 26 families will be able to purchase tickets for \$1 each. Each gift that we provide will be assessed a value of between one and three tickets (ie. bikes and some electronics would be 3 tickets each). Families will be able to trade in their tickets to purchase gifts for each of their children. Monies raised from the sale of tickets will help to provide the turkeys the staff usually buys for these families for their Christmas dinner. This project was developed with the help of the book, When Helping Hurts, and other resources found through the Chalmers Center for Economic Development and the Christian Community Development Association.

So what are we doing?

We will be collecting new toys, books, sports equipment, electronics and bikes from now until Dec. 16th. We do not know sizes of the children so we will not be collecting new clothing. There are 33 elementary aged children (20 boys and 13 girls), a few middle school children, and 1 female and 2 male high school students, in the 26 families we will be helping. We are still checking about toddlers and babies.

We are also in need of wrapping paper and tape and gift tags so that the presents can be wrapped during the evening of the event.

What a great opportunity!

Cornerstone has been such a blessing to these families in the past couple of years by providing food, coats and school supplies. Now let’s help to share the joy of Christmas with those less fortunate.

Feel free to make or have your children make Christmas cards sharing the reason for the season.

We will gladly include them with the gifts.

3. CHILI COOK-OFF WINNING RECIPE!

Since there were so many people that asked me to go under cover and “retrieve” the recipe for the winner of the Annual Chili Cook-off, I knew this must be one of the Top 5– the Truth must be told! Here is my Top Secret report:

Day 1: I cautiously approach the winner of the Chili Cook-off, Keri Reed. I know she will be tense, carefully guarding her secret recipe and ready to run at the slightest indication of danger. I act nonchelaunt, as if I’m just going to ask what time it is – I know I have to use my super sleuth skills of soft interrogation so I don’t scare her off... “So hey Keri, so you know what time it is?” (Puzzled look from Keri.) “Dave, why don’t you look at your watch? Oh, it must be broken. Anyway, I was just looking for you. A couple people have asked me for my chili recipe – would you mind if I emailed it to you so you could post it in the Connection?” “Why sure, if you really want to...”

Day 2: Email received from Keri with the recipe included. A very “difficult” case closed.

Ingredients

- 2 (14.5-ounce) cans white beans
- 1 tablespoon [canola oil](#)
- 2-3 medium [jalapeno](#) peppers, finely chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 [garlic cloves](#), minced
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon ancho chili powder



4 cups low-sodium [chicken broth](#)
2 limes, juiced, plus lime wedges, for serving
1 [rotisserie chicken](#), skin removed and meat shredded
1/4 cup chopped cilantro leaves
[Sour cream](#), for topping
Monterey Jack cheese for topping
Tortilla chips, coarsely crushed, for topping



Directions

Drain and rinse the canned white beans. In a medium bowl, mash half of the beans with a potato masher until chunky. Reserve the beans until needed.

Add the canola oil to a large [Dutch oven](#) and heat it over medium-high heat. Add the peppers, onions, and garlic and saute until soft and fragrant, about 5 minutes. Season the vegetables with salt, and pepper, to taste. Add the cumin and [chili powder](#) and continue to saute for 1 more minute to toast the spices. Stir in the [chicken stock](#), and lime juice and bring to a simmer. Add the beans and continue to simmer for 20 more minutes.

After 20 minutes of simmering, taste for seasoning, and adjust if necessary. Stir in the shredded rotisserie chicken and cilantro and simmer until heated through, about 5 more minutes. Serve the chili in individual bowls topped with a dollop of sour cream, crushed tortilla chips, and lime wedges.

Serves: 4-6 Double the recipe to fill a large Crock pot.

4. PREPARE TO HOST OUR HOMELESS – WARM at Cornerstone:



Share God's love and provisions some of our St. Mary's county homeless neighbors through the "WARM Program" – Wrapping Arms 'Round Many. Cornerstone will host up to 25 WARM guests from **6-13 January 2013** in the new ballroom/gymnasium. WARM is a St Mary's county faith based volunteer organization to provide overflow housing for the local homeless shelters/transitional housing (such as Three Oaks) during the winter months (November – March). Cornerstone will provide a safe and warm place to sleep for up to 25 homeless people, typically adults (men and women) only, for 7 consecutive nights in addition to breakfast & dinner. You can help us realize this blessing by volunteering your services and talents.

This is a great opportunity for **small groups and families to minister together**. **On-site training is this Saturday, Dec 8, 3:30-5pm.** Contact Tony Bowie for more information. [Click here.](#)

WARM Volunteer Opportunities:

- **Overnight Monitors** - There will be at least one man and one woman on duty per shift X two shifts per night X seven nights = 28 slots for monitors. First shift is 7 pm to 1 am, and second shift is 1 am to 7 am. The Overnight Monitors supervise all WARM guests and **MUST REMAIN AWAKE** during their 6 hr shift.
- **Alongsider / Activities** - We are looking for friendly people (individual or family) to share a meal or activity/game with our WARM guests and engage them in conversation.
- **Bible Study Leader** - Lead a Bible study (1 or 2 total) for any interested WARM guests. Recommended duration is approximately 30-45 minutes. Bible study night preference at the discretion of Bible study leader.
- **Food Service** - PREPARE and/or SERVE breakfast and/or dinner to WARM guests and any Cornerstone volunteers.
- **Inclement Weather Crew** - To provide guest transportation, if necessary, during inclement weather. Also, looking for volunteers to remove snow & ice from the Cornerstone grounds, if necessary.
- **Cleaning** - Cornerstone facility (ballroom/gymnasium, kitchen, bathrooms); bed sheets; towels; blankets; cots.
- **Supplies Set-Up or Transport** - Set-up (cots/tables/chairs) and/or transport supplies (cots/plastic supply bins) from Cornerstone to the next WARM host site.

- **VBS DATE SELECTED – MARK YOUR CALENDARS NOW! JULY 29 - AUGUST 2**

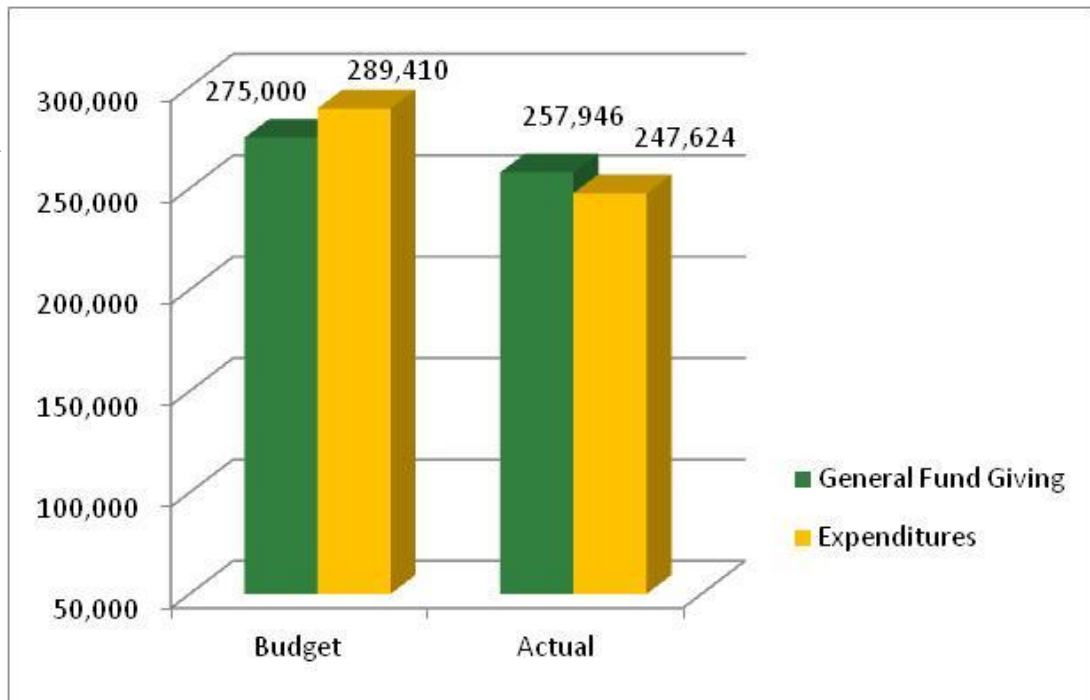

- **FINANCIAL REPORT**

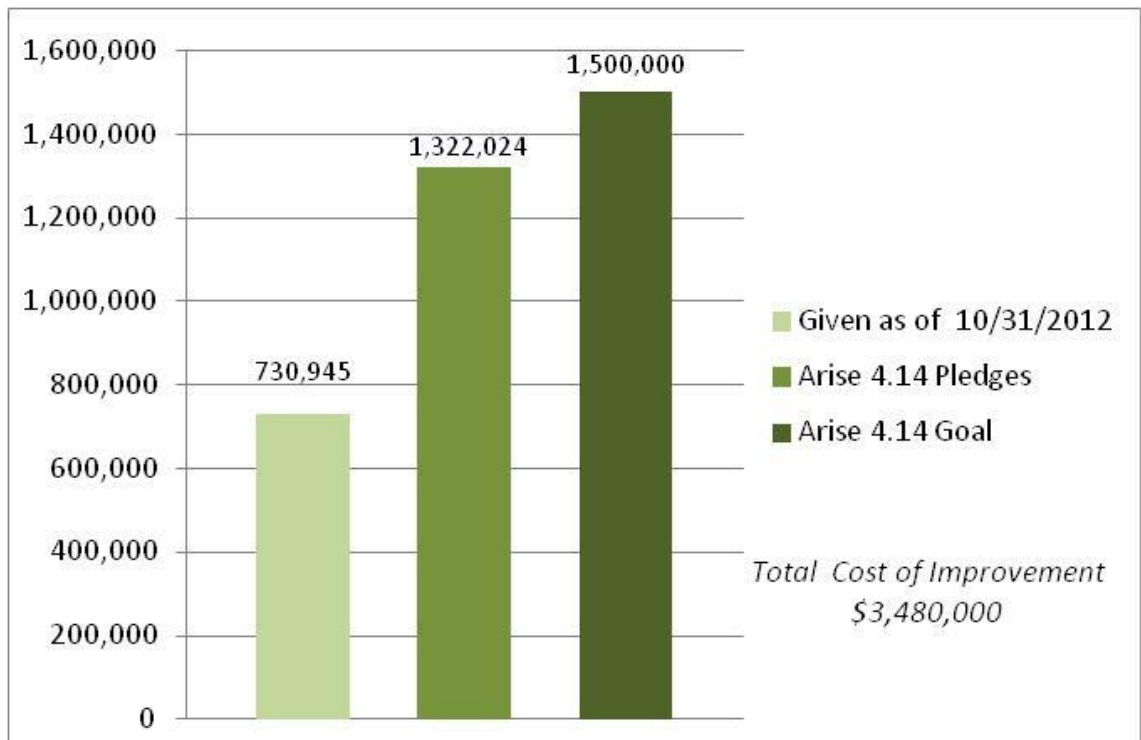
There have been a few folks asking about the status of our finances this year. So we have a couple charts that should provide what you are looking for. **This information was collected on October 31, 2012.**

Below is a chart showing the status of General Fund Giving and what we’ve spent (Expenditures) from the start of this Ministry Year (MY) in **July through October 31, 2012.** (FYI, at this point last year, our General Fund Giving was \$262,286, which is about \$4,000 more than this year.)

- **HCA CHRISTMAS FESTIVAL, DEC 8, 5:30PM @ SAYSF BIBLE CHURCH**

The Homeschool Christian Academy (HCA) is holding a Christmas Festival on **Saturday, December 8th at SAYSF Bible Church (on Rue Purchase Road).**

The event is a free Christmas celebration that showcases the skills students are learning at HCA. The evening **begins at 5:30pm** with The Praise Chorus, Public Speaking Students, and Band. The Drama class will present: *It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play* by Joe Landry at 7:00pm. All are welcome!

- **WANT TO USE THE BALLROOM OR A CLASSROOM?** There is a new process:

In order to be good stewards of the great facility that God has given us, and to make this facility as accessible as possible with accountability, we are putting the following process into place if you want to use the facility.



1. Facility Request: First, fill out a [Facility Request](#). This is available online now, with tools to let you check if the rooms you want are available, and a map of the facility with room numbers. Fill out the online form, and Vicky or I (Dave Perrin) will respond with an email to let you know that you have the room reserved. (Remember that the office is open Monday – Thursday each week.)
 - i. The online form is available via the website – look for the “resources” menu option on the home page, then “Facility Request”... (check it out now – [click here](#))
2. Key Checkout: To get into the building, you will need a key. Plan to pick up your key if you don’t already have one .
3. Opening: There are instructions to assist with lights, heating/AC, etc. Also note if you notice damage or a mess so that you are not held responsible.
4. CLEANING & Closing: There will be a checklist to complete each time the facility is used, and you will need to sign this when you have finished. This will also give us a record of who is using the facility.
 - ii. These checklists are kept on 3 clipboards – one for each major area of the facility: Ballroom, Sanctuary building, and new building Classrooms. These are hung in the Janitor’s closet for the respective building – i.e. the clipboards for the Ballroom and new building Classrooms are in the Janitor’s closet next to the kitchen, and the clipboard for the Sanctuary building is in the Janitor’s closet next to the women’s restroom in the Sanctuary building.
 - iii. Return chairs and equipment (and the clipboards) to the location that you found them, if you have moved them.
5. Key Return: The key should be returned immediately after the event before you leave the facility, unless the key has been assigned for a longer period of time (recurring event, etc).

I know that these steps are common for most facilities, and similar to our unwritten process that we’ve used. But we are formalizing them as the facility has grown and more people will want to use it. We will strive to remain flexible for spontaneous events that pop up – we want the facility to be used for as much ministry as possible. At the same time we want to keep it clean for the next group using it, so be sure to complete and sign the Cleaning & Closing checklist when you are done!
