Christmas in April \* St. Mary's County, Maryland, Inc. is a local chapter of Rebuilding Together, a national volunteer organization that, in partnership with the community, rehabilitates the homes of low-income homeowners, particularly the elderly and disabled, so that they may live in warmth, safety, and independence. We also provide help through work on community projects in St. Mary's County.

In the past 22 years, Christmas in April \* St. Mary's County, Maryland, Inc. volunteers have repaired over 631 homes; 14 community nonprofit facilities have received help with repairs; 35,900 people have shared their time and talents; and have made free home repairs worth more than \$5.2 million to improve the living conditions of the low-income, elderly, and disabled homeowners in St. Mary's County.

#### Short Term Missions Trips – 2 of them! Turn in applications NOW!

This summer there will be 2 short term mission (STM) trips – Guatemala to the My Special Treasure orphanage, and one in the “local” area to Inner-City Baltimore.

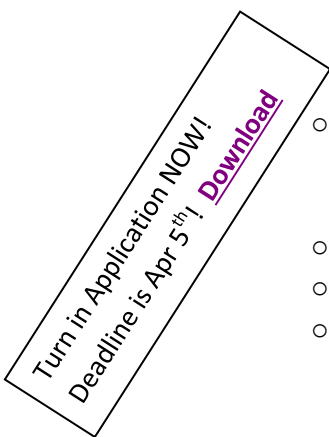
- We are immediately taking applications for both STM trips for team members and leaders – the **deadline for applications is Apr 5<sup>th</sup>**. [Click here to download](#).
- Due to many different factors, **all funds must be raised by Jun 2<sup>nd</sup>**.

Here are some things to keep in mind if you want to be a “Cornerstone missionary” on one of the teams:

- You must support fundraising, to include writing letters to multiple friends and family. This is part of the “missionary experience”.
- You must attend all training exercises unless providentially hindered. If you miss training, you must coordinate with the trip leader to make up the work.
- You must be willing to share your testimony and the Gospel with others.

Here is a brief description of each trip. More details to come:

- **Baltimore Inner-City short-term mission trip – “[Mercy & Grace for the City](#)”–Jul 2-7**
  - In support of a PCA church plant in North Baltimore City called [City Church](#), the team will be working with non-profit organizations that are helping the elderly, renewing city infrastructure, mentoring kids, and more. The exact tasks have not been decided yet, since they will be tailored specifically for the make-up and structure of the team.
  - This trip is to be similar to the trips made to Fairmont, WV in the past – close to home so travel costs are low and more people can afford to come AND **families** are encouraged to minister together (**minimum age of 10**). (~\$315/person)
  - Lodging will be in a **youth hostel**.
  - Trip size will be **10-20 people**.
  - The **goal** is to support the relationships that M&G for the City as developed with the non-profits and people of North Baltimore. Also, that team members will gain experience in learning about City culture and serving at the places of greatest need. You’ll be exposed to the real issues of the city and those who are working on the “front lines” in the City. Ample time will be given each day to debrief the experience and pray for God’s work in the City.

- **Guatemala short-term mission trip – “My Special Treasure” orphanage–Jun29-Jul 6**
  - This will be the 4<sup>th</sup> Cornerstone STM trip to My Special Treasure, and orphanage of about 12 girls which are sponsored by Cornerstone members.
  - Time will be spent with the girls building relationships and investing in them – teaching the girls English, and getting taught Spanish, playing basketball and soccer, singing together (in English and Spanish), praying together, cooking, touring Guatemala City, etc. Specific itinerary will be developed.
  - Lodging will be in a mission house / hotel – TBD.
  - Trip size will be no more than **8 people**.
  - The **goal** is continue building the relationship between the orphans and workers of My Special Treasure and the congregation of Cornerstone. Also, that the girls would be encouraged to grow spiritually, mentally, and physically.

**“Partnering” with low-income individuals taking a Faith & Finance Class**

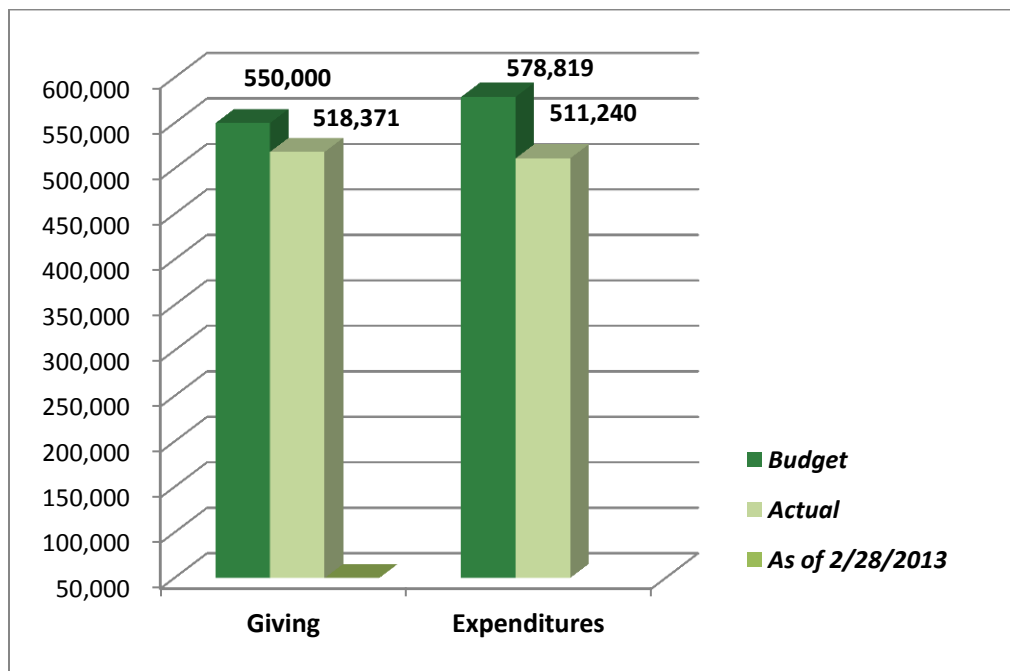

## 4. FINANCIAL UPDATE

Below is a chart depicting our overall financial situation at the end of February. It shows budgeted Giving vs. actual Giving, and budgeted Expenses vs. actual Expenses for the time period July 2012 through February 2013.

What is the chart saying? Cornerstone's actual giving is \$ 31629 below our budgeted giving (the amount we estimated would be given). But you can also see that due to a delay in assuming our mortgage payment, our expenditures (what we have spent) are less than what has been given (by \$7131), so we are operating in "the black".

We are grateful for your generosity and trust the Lord to provide and propel our ministry forward.

- **TMT FOCUS ON MENTORING RELATIONSHIPS**

Cornerstone's Transformational Ministry Team (TMT) is working to form a **Mentoring Team – a core of people who will focus on the mentoring of those in our society that are caught in material poverty**. This effort is due to an increased awareness that lives can only be transformed through the reconciliation of relationships, which can take a long time. Mentoring provides a way to enter into a long term partnership that will allow time for relationships to be reconciled – relationships with the material world, but also relationships with God, self, and others.

It is our belief that **poverty can be defined as broken relationships**. This includes how we normally think of "poverty" = broken relationships with the material world. But it also includes the poverty of broken relationships with ourselves, with others, and most importantly with God. Therefore, **poverty encompasses more than just the materially poor – it encompasses all of us**.

But God did not leave the world, including us, to ourselves. He has been and continues to be at work **"...to reconcile to himself all things."** [Col 1:15-20](#) / [2 Cor 5:18-20](#)

And **God calls us to join him in this ministry of reconciliation as His ambassadors.** [2 Cor 5:17-20](#)

**Are you interested in helping with this mentoring reconciliation effort?**

**We need more than just mentors** – we need some to develop training and support materials, we need some to be a support to the mentors, and of course we need mentors.

Anyone can join this team, since it needs people with many different skills and gifts.

**Right now we are developing the training material** so that our mentors are well trained and equipped. **If you have experience with training, teaching, social work, counseling, or administration**, and would like to help, please **contact [Dave Perrin](#)**.



Much of the philosophy that is mentioned here was developed with the help of the book, *When Helping Hurts*. If you are intrigued by this, you can pick up a copy of the book on the book shelf in the foyer of the sanctuary.

### Hymn of the Month – Thine Be the Glory

Edmond L. Budry wrote "A Toi la Gloire," "Thine Be the Glory," in 1884, reportedly after the death of his first wife, Marie de Vayenborg. It was first published in Chants Evangeliques in Lausanne, Switzerland, 1885. It was translated into English in 1925 by Richard B. Hoyle, and appeared in Cantate Domino Hymnal, 1925, the hymnal of the World Student Christian Federation. Thine Be the Glory, Risen Conquering Son is a popular Easter Christian hymn set to the tune of the chorus from Handel's oratorio Judas Maccabaeus. "Conquering Son" is not a name used often for Jesus, but it is a fitting military title for the One whose resurrection Christians celebrate each Sunday, and not just on Easter day.
