DISCIPLE: This group focuses on teaching the Cornerstone Community how to apply the Gospel so they live deeply satisfying lives that are radically different and selfless, stirring themselves and others toward restoration.

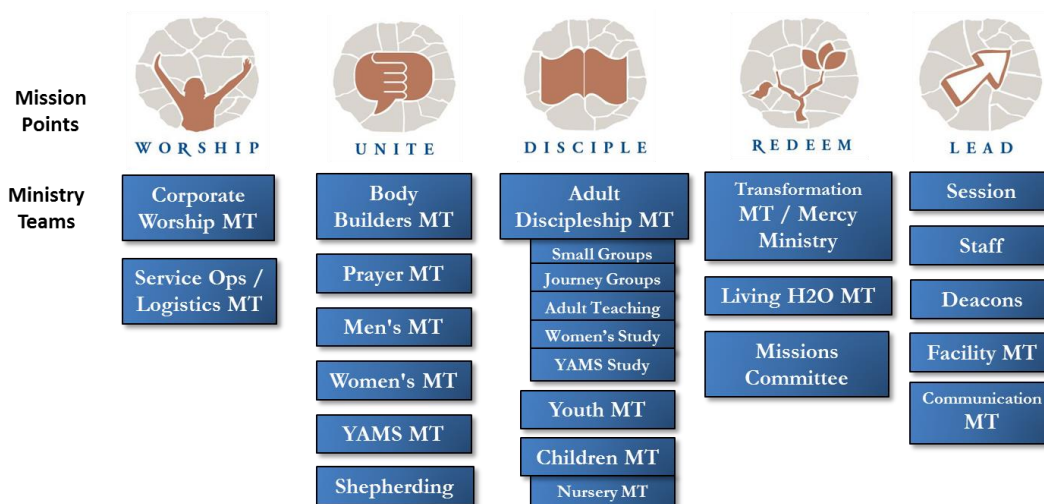
UNITE: This group focuses on building unity within the Cornerstone Community thru deep relationships.

2. NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER @ CORNERSTONE – MAY 2

Did you know? The **National Day of Prayer** tradition predates the founding of the USA, as evidenced by the Continental Congress' proclamation in 1775 setting aside a day of prayer. In 1952, Congress established an annual day of prayer and, in 1988, that law was amended, designating the National Day of Prayer as the first Thursday in May. On **Thurs., May 2**, we will be observing the National Day of Prayer with 3 opportunities for dedicated corporate prayer here at the church in the Hospitality Rm. (rms. 119 & 120): **7-8:30 am, 12:30-2 pm, and 7-8:30 pm**. There will be someone here to facilitate/lead each of the prayer times. Feel free to attend whichever session, and for whatever amount of time your schedule allows. Each session will begin with a brief discussion of how best to pray for our Nation in these challenging times. No need to sign up in advance—just come!

3. BALTIMORE MISSION TRIP – APPLY BY APR 22

This summer there will be a short term mission (STM) trip to Inner-City Baltimore.

Here are some things to keep in mind if you want to be a “Cornerstone missionary” on one of the teams:

- You must support fundraising, to include writing letters to multiple friends and family. This is part of the “missionary experience”.
- You must attend all training exercises unless providentially hindered. If you miss training, you must coordinate with the trip leader to make up the work.
- You must be willing to share your testimony and the Gospel with others.

Here is a brief description of the trip:

 - In support of a PCA church plant in North Baltimore City called [City Church](#), the team will be working with non-profit organizations that are helping the elderly, renewing city infrastructure, mentoring kids, and more. The exact tasks have not been decided yet, since they will be tailored specifically for the make-up and structure of the team.
 - This trip is to be similar to the trips made to Fairmont, WV in the past – close to home so travel costs are low and more people can afford to come AND **families** are encouraged to minister together (**minimum age of 10**). (~\$315/person)
 - Lodging will be in a **youth hostel**.
 - Trip size will be **10-20 people**.



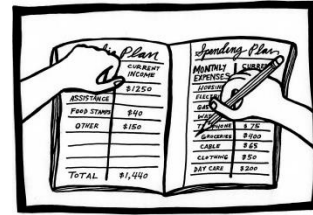

Faith & Finances provides encouragement and accountability to people with low to moderate incomes as they seek to manage money wisely. Job Description: FAITH & FINANCES ALLY (MENTOR)

Job Summary:

Allies promote and sustain individuals in the *Faith & Finances* program. Allies are mutual learners on the journey with participants. A team of allies (2-3) is placed with a participant to provide encouragement, advocacy, and supportive friendship as he/she strives to become economically self-sufficient.

Responsibilities:

- Attend and participate in *Faith & Finances* financial education course as a mutual learner with participant (at least one of the Allies per person will need to attend);
- Maintain contact with participant at least twice a month during and after financial education course to provide encouragement and accountability in reaching goals;
- Commit to building a relationship with participant and meet monthly for at least 12 months;
- Pray, eat, share, and spend time with participant regularly, including assistance with savings goals: reviewing budgets, discussing asset purchases, enrolling in educational courses, etc.;
- Avoid any direct financial relationship with participants without first contacting the advisory team; and
- Commit to being a *Faith & Finances Ally* for **one year**.

Qualifications:

- Follower of Jesus who maintains a vision for His kingdom and reconciliation of all things, including personal finances and assets;
- Passion to see low-income people grow spiritually and economically;
- Motivated heart of a learner, servant, and encourager;
- Experience in applying biblical principles of finance to personal life; and
- Two years' experience managing personal finances and building assets.

- **TMT FOCUS ON MENTORING RELATIONSHIPS**

Cornerstone's Transformational Ministry Team (TMT) is working to form a Mentoring Team – a core of people who will focus on the mentoring of those in our society that are caught in material poverty. This effort is due to an increased awareness that lives can only be transformed through the reconciliation of relationships, which can take a long time. Mentoring provides a way to enter into a long term partnership that will allow time for relationships to be reconciled – relationships with the material world, but also relationships with God, self, and others.



It is our belief that **poverty can be defined as broken relationships**. This includes how we normally think of “poverty” = broken relationships with the material world. But it also includes the poverty of broken relationships with ourselves, with others, and most importantly with God. Therefore, **poverty encompasses more than just the materially poor – it encompasses all of us**.

But God did not leave the world, including us, to ourselves. He has been and continues to be at work “...to reconcile to himself all things.” [Col 1:15-20](#) / [2 Cor 5:18-20](#)
And **God calls us to join him in this ministry of reconciliation as His ambassadors.** [2 Cor 5:17-20](#)

Are you interested in helping with this mentoring reconciliation effort?

We need more than just mentors – we need some to develop training and support materials, we need some to be a support to the mentors, and of course we need mentors.
Anyone can join this team, since it needs people with many different skills and gifts.

Right now we are developing the training material so that our mentors are well trained and equipped. **If you have experience with training, teaching, social work, counseling, or administration**, and would like to help, please **contact [Dave Perrin](#)**.

Much of the philosophy that is mentioned here was developed with the help of the book, *When Helping Hurts*. If you are intrigued by this, you can pick up a copy of the book on the book shelf in the foyer of the sanctuary.

Hymn of the Month – Christ the Lord is Risen Today

Charles Wesley wrote this hymn in 1739, in celebration of the first service of London's first Wesleyan Chapel. This chapel was known as the Foundry Meeting House, as it was a deserted foundry. Charles Wesley purchased the building to house his growing number of converts.

The "Alleluia" which we sing at the end of each line was not part of the original hymn, it was added later by some unknown editor, to better fit the tune. "Alleluia," or "Hallelujah" is a common expression of praise, "Praise ye the Lord," from the early Christian Church. Early Christians would greet each other Easter morning, "Alleluia, the Lord is risen!" Jerome, who died in 420, was an important leader of the early church, who translated the Bible into Latin. He wrote that the very ceilings of houses of worship were often shaken with the reverberating "Hallelujahs" when believers sang their praises to God. This was the first time that the phrase, "Rock the House" was used. 😊
