"We" get to go to Guatemala to work with the "My Special Treasure" orphanage, and to North Baltimore to work in low-income neighborhoods. The total cost for both trips is \$15,256. Including overflow from previous trips, \$8,400 has been given, leaving **\$6856 to be raised by the payment deadline, June 1st**.

- **Baltimore Inner-City short-term mission trip – “[Mercy & Grace for the City](#)”–Jul 2-7**
 - In support of a PCA church plant in North Baltimore City called [City Church](#), the team will be working with non-profit organizations that are helping the elderly, renewing city infrastructure, mentoring kids, and more. The exact tasks have not been decided yet, since they will be tailored specifically for the make-up and structure of the team.
 - Cost of the trip is \$315/person.
 - Lodging will be in a **youth hostel**.
 - The **goal** is to support the relationships that M&G for the City as developed with the non-profits and people of North Baltimore. Also, that team members will gain experience in learning about City culture and serving at the places of greatest need. You’ll be exposed to the real issues of the city and those who are working on the “front lines” in the City. Ample time will be given each day to debrief the experience and pray for God’s work in the City.

- **Guatemala short-term mission trip – “[My Special Treasure](#)” orphanage–Jun29-Jul 6**
 - This will be the 4th Cornerstone STM trip to My Special Treasure, and orphanage of about 12 girls which are sponsored by Cornerstone members.
 - Time will be spent with the girls building relationships and investing in them – teaching the girls English, and getting taught Spanish, playing basketball and soccer, singing together (in English and Spanish), praying together, cooking, touring Guatemala City, etc. Specific itinerary will be developed.
 - Lodging will be in a mission house / hotel – TBD.
 - The **goal** is continue building the relationship between the orphans and workers of My Special Treasure and the congregation of Cornerstone. Also, that the girls would be encouraged to grow spiritually, mentally, and physically.

2. FINAL NIGHT FOR THE BIG GATHERING – SUNDAY, MAY 19



Sunday, May 19, will be the final Big Gathering of this ministry year. This was the first year that we held the Big Gathering at Cornerstone, and we want to **celebrate how God worked in many ways** to mature and equip us thru the 8 adult small groups, youth group (averaging 42 youths), 2 children's choirs (averaging 57 kids), and nursery averaging 7 children. But do we measure maturity through numbers?

No, maturity is not measured by numbers, but by fruit.

At the Big Gathering, adding numbers was not our primary goal or vision. **The primary goal was Discipleship** – helping us all become more like our Master, Jesus. And this applies to all ages.

So what was some of the fruit? Well, the Children's Choirs and Clubs had fruit growing all over the place! This group grew not only in numbers, but also in the ability and desire to welcome new kids into the group, as well as encouraging each other in their musical gifts and friendships. And not only the kids grew, but there were so many faithful adults that served in those ministries – so we saw hearts of compassion and giving in many of those classrooms in the Children's wing on Sunday nights.

Adult small groups saw many relationships forming and growing deeper, much learning about our Great God and applying that to life and relationship with Him, and some new believers were born even – lives changed as the Holy Spirit opened eyes to the Truth.

We saw the youth grow in the small group settings, as that has now become an accepted and regular part of Youth Group. In these small groups, intimacy and deeper relationships were formed.

So we pause and celebrate God's faithful drawing of His children into greater knowledge of Him – and not just head-knowledge, but a heart-knowledge of our perfect Friend and Father. We see the fruit that can only come from changed hearts, and give Him the glory. Thank you God!

What is a Disciple?

In short, a disciple is a follower of Jesus Christ, someone who is increasingly trusting Jesus Christ and living their life in response to his mercy and grace.

What is Spiritual Maturity?

It's important to clarify what it isn't because there are so many definitions that fall short.

- Spiritual maturity is *not* just having a lot of Bible knowledge. Although understanding the Bible is a significant factor that drives spiritual growth, simple head knowledge is not sufficient in itself. There is a difference between knowing and doing God's word.



- Spiritual maturity is *not* merely having high commitment. Commitment is an integral attribute of a spiritually mature life, but commitment in itself doesn't equate to spiritual maturity.
- Spiritual maturity is *not* simply longevity, that is how long a person has been a Christian. Although time is necessary to grow as a disciple, length of time as a Christian is not the indicator of spiritual maturity. There are too many Christians who have been Christians for decades but whose spiritual maturity plateaued shortly after becoming a Christian.



...So what is Spiritual Maturity?

It is what we call being a *mature* and *equipped* disciple of Jesus Christ.

A *mature disciple* of Jesus Christ is one who has the demonstrated faith of a follower of Jesus. One who in their:

- Relationship with God
 - Has a growing understanding of his/her unbelief AND a growing trust in Christ's forgiveness and righteousness.
 - Lives consistently under the control of the Holy Spirit and in response to God's mercy and grace.
 - Regularly studies the Word of God and rightly applies it to his/her lives.
 - Knows what they believe and why they believe it.
 - Regularly communes with God and enacts His will through prayer.
- Relationship with Family
 - Understands and fulfills their life calling in light of God's world mission.
 - Is an effective manager of life, relationships and resources.
 - Is faithfully fulfilling his/her familial role.
- Relationship with Christians
 - Is a faithful and consistent member of God's church.
 - Has trusted relationships with other believers that lead to Christ-likeness.
- Relationship with the World
 - Is socially responsible as a citizen of heaven living in America.
 - Lives a life of integrity in all spheres of influence.
 - Is multiplying him/herself in ministry by investing in others.
 - Is loving others, especially the "least and the lost," and reaching them with the gospel.

An *equipped disciple* of Jesus Christ is one who has and knows how to use the tools of a disciple. One who:

- Understands, utilizes, and develops their spiritual gifts in ministry to others.
- Knows how to study the Bible and develop Christ-centered applications.
- Knows how to share their testimony and the gospel, to lead someone to faith in Jesus Christ, and to adapt their presentation to different people and circumstances.
- Stewards God's resources for the furtherance of His kingdom.

God calls each of us to serve those in need as an expression of love, in response to His love:

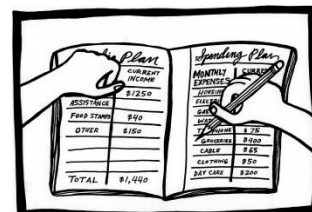

Job Description: FAITH & FINANCES ALLY (MENTOR)

Job Summary:

Allies promote and sustain individuals in the *Faith & Finances* program. Allies are mutual learners on the journey with participants. A team of allies (2-3) is placed with a participant to provide encouragement, advocacy, and supportive friendship as he/she strives to become economically self-sufficient.

Responsibilities:

- Attend and participate in *Faith & Finances* financial education course as a mutual learner with participant (at least one of the Allies per person will need to attend);
- Maintain contact with participant at least twice a month during and after financial education course to provide encouragement and accountability in reaching goals;
- Commit to building a relationship with participant and meet monthly for at least 12 months;
- Pray, eat, share, and spend time with participant regularly, including assistance with savings goals: reviewing budgets, discussing asset purchases, enrolling in educational courses, etc.;

Hymn of the Month – All Hail the Power of Jesus Name

Edward Perronet, the son of an Anglican vicar, originally introduced "All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name." His family was closely associated with John Wesley of the Anglican Church. The verses written by Perronet have been called "The Coronation Hymn." The lyrics affirm the kingship of Christ and His authority. Much of the imagery used is from the Book of Revelation and from Jeremiah. The music sounds particularly beautiful when played by a violin. One of the more famous stories surrounding "All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name" involves the use of a violin.

A missionary to India named E. P. Scott learned of a wild mountain tribe that had never been introduced to the message of Christ. Since they had never been presented with the gospel, he decided to visit that tribe. When he reached their mountain home, he discovered a group of savages on a war expedition. They took him back to camp and threatened to kill him. He closed his eyes and starting playing " All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name" on his ever-present violin. The natives were so overcome; they dropped their spears and invited Rev. Scott to stay with them. He lived among them for over two years, converting many to Christianity.

Did you know that there is one overarching story in the Bible?
