History Timeline

1400 - 1500 BC: God wrote the 10 Commandments in ancient Hebrew on stone.

500 BC: 39 books that make up the Old Testament were completed and preserved in Hebrew on scrolls.

First Century AD: New Testament had been completed and was preserved in Greek on papyrus.

393 AD: African senate of Synod officially approved the New Testament for the entire Church.

500 AD: Bible had been translated into 100's of different languages.

600 AD: Bible was restricted to only Latin. All other versions were considered illegal. Catholic church of Rome was the only recognized church in the land.

400-1400 AD: Known as the "Dark Ages."

500s - 1300s: Columba started the Secret Bible Society made up of the "Culdees"

1380: John Wycliffe first person to translate the Bible into English.

1415: John Huss was burned at the stake for his stance for the Bible. "In the next 100 years, God will raise up a man whose call for reform cannot be suppressed."

1450's Guttenberg Press Books and manuscripts could be more easily reproduced

1498 John Colet: Son of the mayor of London. Oxford Professor who translated the bible into English for his Oxford students.

1517: Martin Luther - Thesis on the church door in Wittenberg.

1526: William Tyndale printed the first English Bible. Anyone caught with it – would be executed immediately.

1536: Tyndale was incarcerated before he was strangled and burned at the stake. Before dying, he prayed, "Oh Lord, open the King of England's eyes".

1539: King Henry VIII finally allowed (and even funded) the printing of an English Bible.

1604: With the death of Queen Elizabeth I, Prince James VI of Scotland became <u>King James I of England</u>. The Protestant clergy announced their desire for a new translation to replace the Bishop's Bible first printed in 1568.

1611 the first King James Bible came off the printing press.
