Should Christians Celebrate St. Patrick's Day?

Pinches if you aren't wearing green. Corned beef and cabbage. Three-leaf clovers.

We recognize the Irish-themed decorations every March, but what is St. Patrick's Day really about?

Most St. Patrick's Day traditions are less about the person and more about celebrations of Irish-American immigrants in the late 1700s.

St. Patrick was a real man who lived around AD 400, but the folklore we hear doesn't tell the whole story. His life wasn't about wearing green or driving snakes from Ireland, but radical love and faith.

Moving past the modern traditions, we can see what really happened in St. Patrick's life and why it matters to us today.

4 Unexpected Lessons From The Real St. Patrick

1. We can make it through hard times.


Even when we face the most difficult times, we can survive because we're never separated from God's love (Romans 8:38-39).

When St. Patrick was 16, he was kidnapped by pirates and became a slave to Druids, a violent tribal cult in Ireland. Rather than fighting back, he learned to pray and his faith grew, even while tending sheep in the rugged cold. Records of St. Patrick's life show that he chose to trust God every day instead of seeking revenge against his captors.

2. God invites us to do risky, uncomfortable things.

One day, after six years of captivity in Ireland, God told St. Patrick about a way off the island. St. Patrick boarded a ship and returned home. Years later, after learning more about the Bible and becoming a leader in the church, St. Patrick heard God tell him to return to Ireland and tell people about Jesus.

Just like Patrick listened to God leading him to different places and different tasks, we can listen to God and do what He says (<u>James 1:22</u>). When God calls us to something He walks alongside us, no matter how uncomfortable or impossible it seems (<u>Micah 6:8</u>).

3. Grace changes enemies into opportunities for radical love.

St. Patrick escaped the oppressive slavery of the Druids, but he chose to return to Ireland to share the message of Jesus with them.

When God brings us through a difficult experience, we learn to accept His incredible love and extend that same love to everyone. We were all enemies of God because of our sins, but Jesus loves us even when we rebel against Him (Romans 5:10). Jesus' love is so radical that it forgives offenders and welcomes enemies.

4. God can use anyone—even you.

St. Patrick wasn't born a Christian superhero who rose to fame and changed his country. He wasn't even Irish. He grew up in a wealthy British family and had no interest in Christianity until he was older.

No matter where you're from or what you have or haven't done, God can work through you to do something amazing (<u>Philippians 2:13</u>). God changes unlikely people into unexpected leaders.

Who needs the luck of the Irish when we have a God who can use anybody to continue a movement that affects everybody?

Shepherd's Pie

Ingredients:

6 medium potatoes, peeled and roughly chopped 6 tbs grated parmesan plus extra to garnish 3 tbs milk 2 tbs oil 2 medium onions, chopped 4 cloves garlic, minced 500 grams beef mince 1 large carrot, grated 3 tbs tomato paste 3 tbs worcestershire sauce 2 tbs barbecue sauce a few sprigs of fresh thyme 1 1/2- 2 cups stock salt and pepper, to taste



Directions:

Fill a saucepan with potatoes until they are fully immersed. Bring to boil and then reduce the heat to a simmer until the potatoes are completely cooked through. Drain and mash until no lumps remain. I put my potatoes through the mincer attachment on the Kitchenaid to get them completely smooth. Add the grated parmesan, milk and season well with salt and pepper. Set aside.

In a heavy bottom saucepan, heat oil on medium heat. Add to it the chopped onions and fry until just beginning to brown, about 7-8 minutes. Add the garlic and fry for a further minute. Add the mince and keep stirring and mashing the mince until completely broken up and no clumps remain. Keep stirring until the mince has browned and the water has dried up. Add the rest of the ingredients and season with salt and pepper. Simmer on medium heat till the gravy is thick, about 40 minutes. Fill a baking dish with the mince gravy and top with the mashed potato. Use a fork to smooth the top, sprinkle with extra parmesan and bake in the oven for 40 minutes. Serve immediately topped with extra grated parmesan cheese.



Prayer

"What is Prayer?"

The most basic definition of prayer is "talking to God." Prayer is described in the Bible as seeking God's favor (Exodus 32:11), pouring out one's soul to the Lord (1 Samuel 1:15), crying out to heaven (2 Chronicles 32:30), drawing near to God (Psalm 73:28), and kneeling before the Father (Ephesians 3:14). God wants us to talk with Him about everything. How often should we pray? The biblical answer is "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

"How can I become a prayer warrior?"

Although the phrase "prayer warrior" is not found in Scripture, a prayer warrior is generally a Christian who prays continually and effectively for others. As prayer warriors, we rejoice in all things and have a spirit of thankfulness for what God is doing in our lives and the lives of others. Prayer warriors have a heart for God, a heart for prayer, a heart for people, and a heart for Christ's church. So, we pray continually and trust that God answers each prayer in His perfect will and in His perfect timing.

"What is intercessory prayer?"

Intercessory prayer is the act of praying on behalf of others. True intercessory prayer seeks not only to know God's will and see it fulfilled, but to see it fulfilled even if it doesn't benefit us and regardless of what it costs us. True intercessory prayer seeks God's glory, not our own. The Bible is clear that *all* Christians are called to be intercessors. All Christians have the Holy Spirit in their hearts and, just as He intercedes for us in accordance with God's will (Romans 8: 26-27), we are to intercede for one another. God calls all Christians to be intercessors. It is God's desire that every believer be active in intercessory prayer. What a wonderful and exalted privilege we have in being able to come boldly before the throne of God with our prayers and requests!
