"God loves Vacation Bible School!" So goes the refrain in my head as we negotiate the challenges of pulling together and pulling off the program each year:

"God loves Vacation Bible School!" - upon finding out we would need to use a Port-a-potty for over 30 children because the plumbing was not functional one year.

"God loves Vacation Bible School!" - upon finding out that the 35 children scheduled for VBS on Friday had "blossomed" into 75 children on Monday, the first day of the program. (What a wonderful challenge to find!)

"God loves Vacation Bible School!" -upon finding out the previously tested "water bugs" did not, in fact, float, and the children were dishing out slimy, gooey pieces of Play-dough from the bottom of a tub. "Well, unlike our water bugs, Jesus did walk on water ..."

"God loves Vacation Bible School!" - upon finding out that one of the art projects included blowing raw eggs out of the shells causing an unbelievably sticky and, potentially, unhealthy activity. Praise God, no child actually became sick!!

"God loves Vacation Bible School!" - upon finding out that one of your key group leaders is going to be unable to attend three out of five days because he was tapped to caddy for a big golf tournament!

And, so it goes! But none of these issues were really what I would call "showstoppers" to our efforts to bring a quality, safe Vacation Bible School to St. Michael's. However, during the last couple of years a paucity of volunteers threatened our ability to put on a good program. It turns out that St. Anne's Catholic Community had experienced a similar issue in the last two years. Thus, was born a partnership! Between the volunteers St. Michael's boasts and the volunteers St. Anne's boasts, we could come together and present a special Vacation Bible School experience for both parish communities and our neighbors! **AND THEN THERE WERE TWO!** What a joy it has been for us to get to know our partners and families from St. Anne's! We hope that this relationship continues for years to come!

URGENT PRAYER REQUEST FOR S. SUDAN...DIOCESE OF RENK

Tues., July 23, in a phone conversation with Bishop Joseph Garang Atem, Diocese of Renk, partner in covenant with St. Michael's since 1998, he reported further need of our prayers. Yesterday, July 22, President of S. Sudan, Salva Kiir, dismissed all ministers from their positions in S. Sudan, including Vice President Riak Machar. When asked if Bishop Joseph knew the reason, he said, "Only the President knows."

And, within a month's time, South Sudan will again stop oil production going to Sudan, causing further suffering for Sudan and S. Sudan.

"We don't know how things are going to be", he said. "In Renk, it is very hard being landlocked all this time (since April). We don't know when the border will reopen, and the civilians are the ones suffering. No fuel, food, medicine, supplies, and very high inflation due to black market smuggling. Renk Theological College is struggling with a lot of things. Students are unable to pay fees this term. We need your prayers. We don't know where our country is going now. But, we trust God, that things will improve. We don't know when."

Bishop Joseph returns to St. Michael's Sept. 5, for his annual visit. On the 29th, Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, he will be presenter at Food for the Journey hosted by the Morning Men's Group. He will be honored guest at South Sudan Soiree III to benefit Renk Theological College Scholarship Fund, Sept. 28. All Women of St. Michael's (AWSM) is planning an evening with Bishop Joseph to share the role of Sudanese women in the family, church, community, Sept. 10, at the home of Shan Atkins. The Men's Group is also hosting an evening with Bishop Joseph, Sept. 13, at the home of Todd Ross. Watch The Sword for announcements of more opportunities to be with the Bishop, while he's here in his home away from home, St. Michael's church community.

Sunday, Sept. 29 will be the occasion of renewing our 15-year Covenant of Relationship and celebrating the development of Renk Diocese and RTC throughout those years.

At its July 15 meeting, the Vestry reflected on the recently completed, three-part parish process and approved the form of a resolution which will be

Vestry members will vote on this resolution at the August vestry meeting, which will be held on August 26. The results (including the number supporting, opposing, and/or abstaining) will be announced to the parish via various means, including the e-*Sword*. The outcome of the vote will represent the Vestry's recommendation (e.g., to allow or not allow) to the Rector for consideration, who then will determine the parish's position on the issue.
