a letter to the people of St. Michael's from the Rector

Dear People of St. Michael's,

+Little Angels Christian Who do you know who relishes anticipating and planning for his or her death? Few if any people that I know. But in the gospel text from Luke that we heard in worship this past Sunday (Luke 12:13-21), Jesus tells a story in which he implicates a man who is so engrossed with this life that he fails to anticipate and take into account his death.

> This scenario brings to mind a new community-wide initiative in the Barrington area called 'Be@ease', funded by Bob Lee's 2012 'Ride for 3 Reasons'. Be@ease asks all local residents to take seriously the value and benefits of intentional and conscientious end-of-life planning. The main feature of the program involves taking the time to simply and clearly communicate your wishes in anticipation of your own death whenever it may come. I encourage you to explore www.beatease.org.

spectacular guest musicians joining us at the 9:30 services. Here is a list of what is coming up:


