Dear People of St. Michael's,

Time and again, the Church has found itself standing at the intersection of the timeless and the trendy.... Some trends are of course merely the fad of the moment, but others become integrated and embedded into our lives such that it is hard to remember life without them. Some "trends" that have become a part of our regular Sunday Church experience include: vestments, organ music, worship services in languages other than Latin!, lay acolytes, individual service books, paper bulletins, microphones, and the list goes on. As you have likely read about in previous Swords, and heard mentioned in Church, we are currently evaluating how to make the best use of our

In particular we have been considering how we can design entry ways that as soon as you walk in the door help people get an impression of who we are and provide functional information to guests, newcomers and parishioners.

As a part of this design process we are looking into the use of what is called 'digital signage'. Even if you have never heard that term before you know what it is! It is everywhere. They are TV monitors used to display information. It would allow us to have a prominently displayed schedule of events (did you know there is a paper schedule put up every day? Most people don't even notice it!), information about upcoming things in the parish, a note of welcome and more displayed in one place. We are wondering if this might be a neat enrichment making good use of technological capacities without being overly invasive or out of place. As a way of trying to imagine how we might make good use of this technology we have mocked up some screens around the Church to show you where they might go, potential sizes, and the kinds of information that might be displayed.
