



Talking with children about God - strategies and tools Sunday September 15th at 10:05am (between the 9am and 10:45am services)

Sometimes kids ask hard questions: What happens when you die? Where does God live? Does Jesus live in everyone's hearts? Today we will be exploring ways we can helpfully talk with children and youth about God. And don't worry, it isn't about having all the answers! Sam Lanham is a parishioner, currently working on her graduate degree in Library Science, and a catechist in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd with over 13 years in the Church School working with children.

Exploring the concept of "Covenant" Sunday, September 22nd at 10:05 a.m. (between the 9:00 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. services)

There are numerous Covenants made in scripture between God and his people: The Covenant with Noah after the flood, the Covenant with the Israelites, the "New" Covenant with Jesus. At Baptism we recite a Baptismal Covenant which has become profoundly important to many Episcopalians. Upcoming project which will shut down the Community Room entrance and/or the Main Entrance.

Construction Update: the current schedule (as of

today, 12 September) is to have both the main front entrance and Community Room entrance available on Sunday, 15 September! Many thanks to the hardworking crew!!

Construction Update/Details:

Beginning on Monday, September 9, the front entrance to the church as well as the Community Room entrance will be closed off for the concrete work to be completed. We will need to use the north side/choir room entrance for access.

At the main entrance, plywood will be put into the windows on each side the doors, horses and caution tape will be surrounding the front plaza. The street parking spots along the east side of Dundee Avenue will be roped off for the construction crew staging area. There may also be a dumpster moved into the two handicap stalls outside the choir room entrance. The concrete from the wooden doors to the public sidewalk as well as a small portion of the sidewalk heading to the north will be replaced. The current plan is to have this work completed by Friday, September 13 (weather permitting).

At the Community Room entrance, there will be a small section of concrete removed. Plywood will be installed to protect the windows at the entrance along with roping off the area with caution tape. The parking spots along the south side of the lower lot will be roped off for the construction crew staging area. The current plan is to have this work completed by Friday, September 13 (weather permitting).

There will also be a portion of the sidewalk along Dundee Avenue that heads to the parking lot replaced along with a section of the sidewalk along the handicap stalls by the choir room entrance. Additional concrete patching will be done on the sidewalks, curbs and along the

ramp by the community room entrance (likely to occur during the week of September 16th).

If there are any delays on the project timeline, the Community Room entrance will be prepared to be open for Sunday, September 15.

Joint Nominating Committee issues important survey [September 9, 2013]

The Episcopal Church Joint Nominating Committee for the Presiding Bishop (JNCPB) has issued a survey and is inviting responses from

all Episcopalians.

"In the summer of 2015, the Church will again assume the responsibility for electing the next Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church," explained Sally Johnson, co-chair of the Committee. "To assist us in that work, the Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop has issued a survey seeking data that will be helpful in our process of developing the profile of the type of leader the Church is seeking."

Recently, at the request of the Committee, the Secretary of General Convention, the Canon Rev. Michael Barlowe, sent an email to all bishops, deputies, alternate deputies and members of Executive Council informing them of the upcoming survey. That message contained a very brief description of the duties of the Presiding Bishop which may be helpful to anyone who wishes to complete the survey.

The electronic survey on Survey Monkey consists of six substantive questions in areas such as most important personal characteristics of the next Presiding Bishop (life deeply formed by scripture and prayer; skillful manager of people and resources; understand and speak multiple languages), activities (engage in fund raising; head the restructuring of the Church; strengthen our relationships in the Anglican Communion) and areas of focus (articulating a compelling vision for the Church; work to heal divisions in the Church; demonstrate a commitment to interfaith and ecumenical cooperation). Six demographic questions request information on age, race, gender, role in the Church, and years as an Episcopalian. "The survey is designed to help us all discern some of the characteristics we hope to see in the person we will elect," noted Johnson. "We want to hear from Episcopalians throughout the church as this will help guide us in our endeavors."

The survey is located here.

Deadline for completing the survey is September 20.

The Committee will release the profile for the next Presiding Bishop in December. It expects to open the nomination process on March 1, 2014.

AWSM: RAISING MONEY FOR MOSQUITO NETS -You can help too!

Thank you to all who contributed to raising close to \$500 on Tuesday, September 10 for the purchase of

mosquito nets in Sudan. Mosquito nets are a very important way to safeguard against malaria, which is a leading killer of children in Africa (every 45 seconds a child in Africa dies from malaria). YOUR HELP IS NEEDED TOO! In his talk on Tuesday evening, Bishop Joseph informed the women of St. Michael's that these nets often only last 6 months - 1 year, so the need in ongoing.

Donation checks may be dropped in the collection plate (please note "mosquito nets" in the memo section of your check), sent by mail or dropped at the church office. All donations are greatly appreciated (each net costs \$12).

AWSM (All Women of St. Michael's) has a "change-for-change" jar available at all of their social gatherings as part of the group's commitment to helping women and children in need.
