From the Rector

Dear people of St. Michael's,

By now, some of you know my 'story of myrrh.' It began in September. An opportunity was announced for local Christian artists: *Please submit ideas for pieces cf art based on the images in the Twelve Days cf Christmas (the well-known Christmas caroi)*. My proposal for 'twelve drummers drumming' was accepted! I began looking around for an old bass drum head on which to paint.

Then I was personally visited by the main organizer of the Barrington Christmas Art Walk. She explained that the whole emphasis had changed. Out with the twelve days of Christmas! They now wanted to focus on the actual Bible stories telling of Christ's birth and directly related events.

The change of emphasis made sense, I agreed. But then I was told that the last three artworks were to represent the Wise Men's gifts to the Christ child. Gold and frankincense were already taken. Would I please create something based on myrth?

Ever since, I've been musing on myrrh - and grappling with how to render it creatively. I went through dozens of ideas. I panicked. I doubted myself and started over, several times. Why couldn't I have been assigned a shinier, more familiar and more comforting part of the story?

In the end, though, I traveled from bewilderment to appreciation. The

journey with myrrh became devotional. In Christ's time, you see, myrrh was often used to anoint the dead. Because of this the magi's gift of myrrh is often thought, in Christian devotion, to prefigure Christ's death. So, the mosaic I created as part of my artwork includes three crowns, for the Three Kings, and also three crosses, anticipating Calvary. I admit that this letter may actually be only a thinly veiled ploy to get you to go on the 12-stop Artwalk that begins today in the Village of Barrington. But in addition, my muse on myrrh leads me to hope and pray that, as we await Christ's birth, you, also, may find a new feature or layer in the story, one that leads you to deeper devotion, faithfulness and joy.
