Christmas Connections

Dear People of St. Michael's,

Yesterday evening I called a parishioner to ask about a family member who'd recently been hospitalized. The report was very good. Before ending the call, the parishioner wanted me to know that he'd just made a discovery: "Our Joseph crèche figure at home has bare feet too!"

The remark may cause you to smile if you shared

in worship yesterday, Advent IV. At the time of the homily I carried the large plaster crèche figure of Joseph into the aisle. I spun him around to show his bare right foot sticking out from his finery and turned upward as he kneels.



Whether or not I was successful, I tried to connect Joseph's bare feet to themes of vulnerability and 'holy ground' that are part of other biblical stories having to do with bare feet and that

Don't worry - I'm not going to suggest that your Joseph crèche figure is a sham if he's shod. This short pastoral letter is mainly about the enjoyable moment of recognition and connection on the phone with a parishioner. It's about hoping that your observance of Christmas may include enjoyable moments of recognition and connection with others, and that some of those moments, at least, will relate to the faith in Christ that we share.
