# From the Rector: Wondering about Wisdom



"... wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king cf the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.'" - Matthew 2:1b-2 Dear People of St. Michael's,

What made the Wise Men wise?

They left their known world and routines in order to follow a peculiar star. If I did that, my family and friends wouldn't call me wise. They'd call me crazy.

The 'wise men' concluded that the king they were seeking was not, after all, a member of any reigning royal household - was, in fact, an infant born to peasants. Was that *wise*? Really?

They broke a promise to Herod and changed their travel plans based on a dream. If I took action on the dream I had last night, no one would call *me* wise.

We heard the Wise Men's story in worship this past Sunday and again on Monday, the Feast of the Epiphany. Ever since, I've been wondering about wisdom.

Who even aspires to be wise these days?

How does the wisdom of God differ from conventional wisdom? How is genuine wisdom expressed collectively - for instance, in a suburban Episcopal parish?

No easy answers here ... but the recognition of no easy answers may, at least, be one key to becoming wise(r). This comes with my prayer that, whatever you or I may make of the Wise Men of old, we may avail ourselves of any and all available light and dreams and trial and error to find our way, as they did, to Christ.
