Dear People of St. Michael's,

I'm guessing that Sunday's annual meeting may not be our most memorable at St. Michael's. I trust it will be efficient, informative and, at times, encouraging. But it may not be all that memorable.

When I first contemplated this, I felt dismayed. Part of me would like us to put on an annual meeting that's like a spiritual Cirque du Soleil. But then I recall some church annual meetings in which I've taken part and that have included stunts, fireworks and swooning (or the equivalent). The meetings were memorable! But more often than not the drama arose from conflict or other trouble.

So, upon further reflection, the best annual meetings may be a bit dull. Compare it, if you will, to a trip to your dentist. You consider it a good visit if it's uneventful and you hear: "Everything seems to be OK ... for your age. Come back in a year." The exam by the dentist would be more memorable but not in a good way if instead you heard: "Oh, dear! Are you insured?"

If an annual meeting is not likely to be all that memorable, why should you go to it? Well, in the case of the annual meeting, most of you are actually more like the dentist than the patient. The wardens, vestry, treasurer, clergy and staff are more like the patient - responsible for much of the day-to-day care and maintenance of the parish. And we're asking you, please, to take an hour or so for a closer look and reflect with us on how we're doing.

Your responses at the Annual Meeting needn't be memorable. But I pray we'll all do our part to contribute to the overall well-being of the good of the whole congregation. Thanks in advance for your participation.
