From the Rector Non-Barking Dogs - and Barking Ones



Dear People of St. Michael's,

Last Sunday's *Food for the Journey* featured a conversation about Jim Collins' 2001 book *From Good to Great*. No,

religious education at St. Michael's has not been usurped by talk of business success. Rather we were mining Collins' research on corporations for ideas that might be relevant to church identity, growth and mission.

Before naming qualities that propel organizations from good to great, Collins names some qualities that he describes as 'dogs that did not bark', a reference to a Sherlock Holmes story. The culprit in a particular crime must be someone who knows a certain vicious dog well, Holmes surmises, because the dog was at the scene of the crime but did not bark at the time. For Collins the 'dogs that did not bark' are qualities that are often *wrongiy* assumed to make a company great.

Collins concept of 'dogs that did not bark' seems relevant to the results of the Church Assessment Tool (aka 'CAT Survey') that were presented to Vestry and THRIVE team members last night here at the church. We scrutinized a truckload of data on the religious identity, impressions and experiences of 238 parishioners. There are stats, graphs, charts and comparisons related to church attendance, parish leadership, worship and music, personal faith and outreach.

The sheer amount of data conveyed in the CAT results is a mixed blessing. We could reach dozens of conclusions that spawn dozens of new ideas and programs. Before doing that, though, I hope and pray that we'll have some lively conversations about which dogs are actually barking and which are not.

None of this may initially sound very biblical or spiritual, but maybe we can see it as another way to pursue what the Church has sometimes called *discernment, prophesy, or the leading cf the Spirit*. What I pray we'll be looking for is this: Which possible ideas, programs or outcomes will only give an appearance of success? And which will 'bark'? Which will genuinely result in deeper faith and more meaningful relationships and ministries for more of us?

Sunday's conversation was the first in a series of open meetings at which we welcome all parishioners' thoughts on ideas arising from the THRIVE program. A dozen of us from St. Michael's are formally taking part in THRIVE. But all parishioners are encouraged to bark.
