

Introduction to Lent by the Rev. Eva Ulrika Baydoun

As we are entering the season of Lent, winter has not yet lost its grip over our part of the country. I do admit I envy my friends back in Sweden who keep e-mailing me pictures of the remarkably early spring flowers growing in their gardens. However I suggest that we make the slow but certain arrival of springtime work in our favor, as it reminds our spirits that God will surely refresh us with new life as we surrender us and our inner winter to him and his warm light.

This inner winter may look different in every one of us, it may be frozen emotions, still lying like glaciers inside us, and we have given up even expecting them to softly melt

down. Likely there are some bad habits, sins, which are tying us down, hindering us, like heavy snow to go in bloom and serve as God intends for us. Some of us may be stuck in thought patterns like self-hatred,



bitterness, and unforgiveness. These patterns restrain us, in a perhaps unseen, but very real manner.

I suggest that this Lent will not be about "giving up something for Lent", but rather surrendering the whole of ourselves to Christ. This surrendering could be made easier by actually forsaking certain food, media and entertainment. But rather than to deprive ourselves for a few weeks before Easter, and then go back to life as usual, lets draw close to the Lord on his way to the cross, and expect to be changed after Easter. Surely Jesus knew that fasting and prayer comes before breakthrough and glory. Alongside of Him, we receive the fullness of his grace as we pay attention and listen to Him, watch and love Him. Close to the heart of Christ His Spirit will bring into the light, whatever He wants us to deal with. Our inner winter, with ice, dead twigs and limited access to full freedom, could meet full springtime about the same time as Easter comes.



The time of Lent is given to us as a wonderful gift, a precious pearl. Lent is given to us as a gift of pure and deep joy as we are once again reminded of our great need, and of the greatness of our living Savior.


To our St. Michael's Family:




Did You Know?


