Lent Madness Update Oh, the Madness! Oh, the agony! Oh, the joy!

Make your vote count at www.LentMadness.org each weekday of Lent. It's not too soon or too late. Toweringly inspiring ancestors of our faithful family are being shunted aside, while others inspiring for her or his own reasons are advancing toward the Golden Halo election, yet clear voting patterns are not readily discernible. At least they are not discernible to this LM participant! As this week's Sword is broadcast, J.S. Bach has been voted out, despite the clearly divine voice which inspired his music. Julia Chester Emery, an early and zealous missionary for what would become ECW and its UTO, has been voted up to the Elate Eight. Do the Lent Madness faithful prefer more contemporary saints to older -- even Biblical -- saints? Do LM voters prefer women saints because they tended to emerge as inspiring personages during typically patriarchal eras? Maybe so. Maybe not. Great matchups remain to be decided by popular vote. You may find that discerning which of two eminently worthy saints compels your vote is a wonder-filled Lenten discipline. You may find yourself surprised by which saint you prefer on a given voting day. You may find that this sometimes anarchic, sometimes snarky, often maddening exercise nonetheless reveals glimmers of the Glory of God through how the saints' lives become reflected in LM participation. 

Watch at the Altar of Repose April 17, 2014 to April 18, 2014

Christians observe a Watch at the Altar of Repose as part of the Holy Week rites in which we remember and

re-enact Christ's Passion. The watch recalls a scene in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night before Jesus was crucified: After praying with great anguish, Jesus discovers that the disciples have been



sleeping. He admonishes them: "Could you not stay awake with me one hour? (Matt. 26:40).

Our Altar of Repose is set up in our chapel, adjacent to the choir room and sacristy - and also accessible from a north-facing exterior door. The watch begins immediately following the 7:30 p.m. Maundy Thursday service and concludes at 6:30 a.m. on Good Friday morning. Devotional materials will be available. Anyone may take part in the watch, whether or not they have signed up. A sign up poster is located in the narthex (front foyer).

Blessed Are The Peacemakers, For They Shall Be Called People Of God An update from Jackie Kraus



It's almost 5 months (April 15) since fighting broke out in South Sudan in a vicious power struggle. Bishop Joseph is continually thankful for our prayers, which he believes strongly are keeping the situation calm in Renk. Peace talks have broken down and been postponed for another month, but the work of peace building is at work in Renk under his leadership.

Last week, a revival was held for 7 days with 800 youth from many tribes in Renk. Bishop Joseph reports there are 63 tribes in Renk! While fighting continues outside Renk, "God is still faithful with us", he says. The revival brought the youth together to prepare themselves as peacemakers in their communities. Bishop Joseph closed the week long gathering with words of encouragement to go out to their families with the support of Renk Diocese taking this message--"Instead of fighting with guns, fight with prayers." He encouraged them to work together. "Take peace into your homes."

And, so we, by our Covenant of Relationship with Renk, pray for the fighting to end, for the situation to cool down, for the ministry of the youth as peacemakers.

The Episcopal Diocese of Chicago Peace and Justice Committee and the Episcopal Peace Fellowship are sponsoring a 14 day trip to the Holy Land from December 26, 2014 to January 8, 2015. The trip includes visits to Jerusalem,

Bethlehem, Galilee, Hebron, Negev, Jericho, Ramallah, Nazareth, and more. The trip is led by Reverend Anthony Vaccaro, M.D. on staff at St. James Cathedral as Director

of Health Ministries.
