+ The Children's/Family Ministries Coordinator position continues to be ably filled by Jeni Younger, who is presently focusing on plans for both summer and fall. We've refined a position description and are working on developing a search process for a permanent coordinator and will share more information in the coming weeks. Meanwhile there's a widespread recognition of reenergizing the involvement of parents and other adult parishioners. We hope households will be considering ways to contribute time and gifts.

+ Preliminary approval for a renovation of the garden columbarium was given by the vestry at its meeting of Monday, April 28. The Vestry authorized Carol Hebert and Suzi Allen to develop a team to work on soliciting designs and bids from three landscaping firms and also authorized some matching funds from the designated columbarium maintenance funds that would be matched by interested parishioners.

Click <u>here</u> to listen to an Easter message from The Rt. Rev. Jeffrey D. Lee, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Chicago approved at the April 28 Vestry meeting, can be read by clicking <u>here</u>. The policy was approved based on research and recommendations over the past few months by Vestry member Ray Kean and by our parish chancellor (legal counsel), Suzi Allen. An explanation of the stickers that will be placed at all exterior church entrances (and an example) can be found in the Illinois State Police press release dated October 2013 that can be viewed <u>here</u>. The Vestry's motion passed by a vote of 10 in favor with 1 opposed and no abstentions and included the direction that the policy take effect, with the stickers being placed, by June 1, 2014.

+ Approval of a plan for acoustic improvements in the Community Room was also made by the Vestry at its April 28 meeting. A digital rendering of what the outcome might look like based on one potential contractor's proposal, may be viewed <u>here</u>.

St. Michael's Bells



St. Michael's thirty foot bell tower consists of 12 silver-colored. cast bronze bells. Each bell has a name, the largest bell is named Michael and is inscribed: "To the Glory of God and in loving memory of Mary Spear Bard." The next two largest bells are named for archangels Gabriel and Raphael. The nine smaller bells are named for female members of the Bard family who donated the bells in 1955. The bells, which range in weight from 101 to 1,100 pounds, were handset in the Netherlands. Birds, mostly sparrows, love to nest in the belfry. They are so used to the bells that they never fly out when the ringing starts. The largest bell also reads: "I
