Trinity Sunday June 15

A friend who's a composer and longtime church musician recently asked me, "So, when's the last time any parishioner of yours walked to the parking lot humming the sermon?" He was partly taking a friendly swipe - from the point of view of the organ bench - at those of us who tend to measure the impact of worship from the pulpit.

But my friend was also seriously, even if indirectly, drawing attention to the importance of music in worship and music's unique spiritual potential. Music in worship is not just filler. Music can find access to the heart and will that can't be found by words and reason.

So far, many or all of you might agree. But when we start to talk about what *kind* of music best elevates the soul - watch out! Christians, including those of us at St. Michael's, are often divided on what music *should* be featured in worship. I've been reminded of this by way of remarks after our summer 9:30 Eucharist: grumblings about 'too much Burgundy Book' or 'too much blue hymnal.' Also, pressing the envelope, some of the music for our *Family Fellowship Church* gathering this Saturday evening at 5 pm will be facilitated by *YouTube*. Really.

The query by my friend, above, was part of a longer conversation in which he argued that the age of the coherent single-music-idiom church is passing away. He also hopefully described the growing number of people who've been able to stop grieving the fact and who have moved into a new, receptive attitude of curiosity, and even satisfaction. My friend recalled a possibly ironic but meaningful moment at a recent interfaith worship and music symposium, mainly attended by mega-church evangelicals. The participants were first put off but ended up awed when they were introduced to and then invited to sing the ancient *Trisagion: "Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us."* [BCP 324] My friend's muse and story made me wonder about my own receptivity to new and unfamiliar music.

I'm partly featuring this music theme here in this letter to ask you to listen to and reflect in the coming weeks on our music ministry at St. Michael's. We'll be featuring a conversation about worship and music at one of our *Food for the Journey* gatherings later this summer.



Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Western Christian liturgical calendar. Trinity Sunday celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday has the status of a Principal Feast in the Church of England and is one of seven principal feast days in the Episcopal Church. Thomas Becket(1118-70) was consecrated Archbishop of Canterbury on the Sunday after Pentecost (Whitsun), and his first act was to ordain that the day of his consecration should be held as a new festival in honor of the Holy Trinity. This observance spread from Canterbury throughout the whole of western Christendom.

Until then, as any musician might say - stay tuned!

Called to Serve...God and his People in Renk

Pentecost O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. All of them look to you to give them their food in due season. You give it to them; they gather it; you open your hand, and they are filled with good things.

From Psalm 104

Every day we learn of famine threatening the displaced chiidren, women and men in South Sudan, including our brothers and sisters in Renk Diocese. The people have fled due to attacks by the rebels. **Bishop Joseph** reports that some were beginning to return. Then, fighting between rebels and government troops broke out again in Renk, June 7 and 8, causing them to flee again. The planting season begins in July, but who will be there to plant? Emergency aid is urgently needed. The people look to God "to give them their food in due season". How are we being called to serve God and the people of Renk? Keep praying for peace, and consider what resources you can offer in this time of need.

You won't read this in the Chicago Tribune...

Sunday evening, there was heavy fighting in Abukhadra, about 10 miles from Renk. The rebels came in shelling the army. Fighting lasted for 5 hours before the army drove them out. "There is no accountability for the signed ceasefire. No peacekeeping monitors have come up to now, and no one knows what will happen next," said Bishop Joseph. "Pray for us."
