Happy First Day of Summer June 21



The summer solstice occurs when the tilt of a planet's semi-axis, in either the northern or the southern hemisphere, is most inclined toward the star (sun) that it orbits. This happens twice each year, at which times the sun reaches its highest position in the sky as seen from the north or the south pole. The summer solstice occurs some time between June 20 and June 22 in the northern hemisphere. The summer solstice day has the longest period of daylight except in the polar regions, where daylight is continuous, from a few days to six months around the summer solstice. Solstice is derived from the Latin words sol (sun) and sistere (to stand still).

Walmart clearance rack! Use your senior discount! Try the resale shops! Put a bin on your porch and have your neighbors pitch in! Clean out your closets and share those outgrown jeans, but remember, gently used means something you would wear--no stains, no tears, and all the zippers work. This is not a time to give "just anything," but a time to help each child feel cared for with nice, clean clothing.
