His position will encompass all of the leadership roles that have been included in the role previously known as Children's Ministry Director, with an emphasis on whole-family participation and recruitment, training and coordination of adult parishioner

Why an interim position?

In consultation with the Wardens and Josh, the decision was made to make this position a 6 month interim due to some significant transitions happening in Josh's household (they will have added 3 children under the age of 4 to their household in the past year!). While all parties hope and pray that we will be able to make a transition from an interim position to a more permanent one, we felt it was important to be honest with the congregation about the circumstances of Josh taking on this ministry. As a leadership team, we are confident that even if Josh were only able to serve the congregation on staff for 6 months he will be a valuable asset who will be able to help us in discerning a vision and model for our ministries with families.

The needs are many for these families that enter Redeemer's doors. Over the years we have managed to find used furniture and appliances as well as food for them. It is estimated that fewer than 50% of skilled nursing facility residents have regular visitors. Visiting a nursing home offers your family an opportunity to directly share God's perfect love.

Blood Drive - Our Goal = 30 Pints

St. Michael's will be hosting a blood drive through LifeSource Blood Center, a not-for-profit organization. Our

area is experiencing a critical seasonal shortage of blood.

The drive will be held in the Community Room on Sunday July 13 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. LifeSource is the sole supplier of blood to Good Shepherd Hospital which regularly schedules as many as



40 or more surgeries a day. Recently some elective surgeries have had to be postponed due to shortages of blood.

If we could donate 30 units (pints) of blood that day it would mean that as many as 90 lives could be positively

impacted as each unit can help 3 persons.

St. Michael's Collecting Jeans! Barrington Giving Day Back to School held at St. Matthew Lutheran Church







Saturday, August 9 is set for the second Barrington Giving Day Back to School event. This local project is a worthwhile and simple volunteer opportunity to include in your summer plans. New and gently used clothing is collected for "Back to School Shopping" for District 220 families with limited resources. The goal is for every child to go back to school in a brand new outfit and more.

St. Michael's will collect new and gently used clothing, focusing on JEANS, which are most needed. Nancy Carney has challenged us to collect 1500 pairs of jeans—enough for two pair for each child. How will we do that?? Please take time to shop sales and purchase jeans for boys and girls, ages 3 to 18. NOTE: Young girls' jeans are needed. We have almost no junior sizes 3,5,7,9. Leverage your Kohl's cash and coupons! Walmart clearance rack! Use your senior discount! Try the resale shops! Put a bin on your porch and have your neighbors pitch in! Clean out your closets and share those outgrown jeans, but remember, gently used means something you would wear—no stains, no tears, and all the zippers work. This is not a time to give "just anything," but a time to help each child feel cared for with nice, clean clothing.

The newly renovated Outreach area near the Community Room now features a **large green cart**. The cart and project was blessed at the 9:30 service on Sunday. Let's share our bounty and fill the cart up several times over and help local school children.
