Blood Drive - Our Goal = 30 Pints

St. Michael's will be hosting a blood drive through LifeSource Blood Center, a not-for-profit organization. Our

area is experiencing a critical seasonal shortage of blood. The drive will be held in the Community Room on Sunday July 13 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. LifeSource is the sole supplier of blood to Good Shepherd Hospital which regularly schedules as many as



40 or more surgeries a day. Recently some elective surgeries have had to be postponed due to shortages of blood.

If we could donate 30 units (pints) of blood that day it would mean that as many as 90 lives could be positively impacted as each unit can help 3 persons. Donors will receive Outback Steakhouse coupons and refreshments. Please eat and drink before donating. Walk ins welcome.
