Knit Together

'Grant us all things necessary for our common life ...'

Dear People of St. Michael's,

Given the title of this letter, 'knit together,' you might think I'm intending here to focus on our prayer shawl ministry here at St. Michael's. It would be a worthy focus! And the prayer shawl ministry serves as one good example of a larger experience that I hope you'll consider as a result of this letter ...

Small group ministries at St. Michael's was the topic of a conversation last night, led by vestry member Pat Kane, in which about seven of us took part. We discussed topics and timing. We considered the differences between an ongoing small group (prayer shawl, choir, men's group) and a one-time series (a Lenten program, a Faith Reflection Group, or last year's sessions on gratitude). We wondered about communications and the value of a survey to determine parishioners' interests.

As we spoke and listened, I kept thinking of two favorite Prayer Book collects. In the prayer for All Saints Day, we thank God that we in the church, the Body of Christ, have been '*knit together ... in one communion and fellowship...*' (p. 245) And in the collect '*for the parish*' we appeal to God to '*grant us all things necessary for our common life.*' (p. 817)

Both of these prayers, I believe, remind us why it's worth talking about and taking part in small group ministries. The prayers may also awaken our often unconscious desire for a sense of belonging. That desire, in turn, is often best satisfied when we join with others in faith and fellowship, in small group ministries, to use our gifts for some common good.

I gather that most of you reading this *Sword* are among the active members who are already taking part in one or



**St. Michael's Garden Columbarium

Beginning Monday, July 28, we'll be undertaking a complete renovation of the outdoor garden columbarium here at St. Michael's Church. It will involve a completely new design and result in all new walking surfaces and plantings. Attached [here](#) find a (nearly final) drawing. You'll note that larger plants will no longer be placed along the wall where they can obscure niches. We will include a fountain or other peaceful water feature and more comfortable bench seating better suited for the contemplation of those who most often visit the columbarium. Five gifted and devoted parishioners, headed by Carol Hebert, have been tending to every detail.


