congregations response to God who revealed himself to his people as "The Lord who heals you" (Exod. 15:26). Currently the Prayer and Study group has reached half time, and it's my impression that we are rejoicing in the fellowship and presence of our wonderful Lord, and each other. Knowing that ultimate healing is salvation, we still have experienced healing in several ways. As disciples we can never dictate the way or time for God to bring healing, praying for healing is rather an expression of faith. For, we believe in the good, almighty Father who "heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds" (Psalm 147:3). We believe in the Son of God, Jesus Christ who saved us on the cross and calls us saying: "Preach the kingdom of God, and heal the sick" (Luke 9:2). And we believe in the Holy Spirit, God himself present and at work. Without him we can't do anything, but for Him everything is possible. And so we pray as beloved children, and we pray also in obedience to his word that says; "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord" (James 5:14).

Later this fall some of us will offer prayer in Sunday's worship. I pray that to be a new routine for all of us, boldly asking for prayer together and growing in faith and trust.






