Dear People of St. Michael's,

Here he comes again - John the Baptist. He always shows up in the gospel readings on these first Sundays in Advent. He can seem like a downer party-crasher. We're just trying to have a holiday good time here. Why spoil it? And who really finds the word *sin* to be meaningful anymore, anyway?

But humor me for just a moment as I try to connect John the Baptist and *Theory U*, a recently popular (and secular) change management model for organizations. Do you know about it?

Theory U invites us to think of the left point of the U

as where we are and the right point of the U as where we want to be. Are you getting a sinking feeling? If so, you may be grasping the sometimes difficult journey proposed by Theory U. In his 2007 book, *Theory U: Leading from the Future as it Emerges*, Otto Scharmer writes:



Moving down the left side of the U is about opening up and dealing with the resistance of thought, emotion and will; moving up the right side is about intentionally reintegrating the intelligence of the head, the heart and the hand ...


Scharmer's words, it seems to me, could be used to describe an authentic journey through Advent. We might prefer to waltz between the points of the U (Thanksgiving and Christmas) on a straight line of Christmas lights and have a knock-out eggnog waiting on the other side. John the Baptist - and maybe even Scharmer - might argue that the string of lights won't hold all the weight we're carrying. They might also urge us to pause before we bee-line for the eggnog, at least long enough to identify our true best destinations.



Our former Sr. Warden, **Kathy Randolph**, will graduate tonight from the Volunteer Chaplain Training program at


Bishop Anderson House. The program not only equips students with basic skills necessary for compassionate care, but




