### Sorefooted, grumbling and hostile

... such a long journey: The ways deep and the weather sharp, The very dead of winter.

Dear People of St. Michael's,

The few lines of poetry above, from TS Eliot's Journey of the Magi, seem apt for this week of extreme cold. I played Eliot's own WWII-era recording of the poem for those who took part in our Eucharist for the Feast of the Epiphany, this past Tuesday.

As I shared during that Eucharist, two aspects of

the poem particularly grabbed my attention. First, Eliot's depiction of the journey questions the twinkly-starred ambiance that often hovers over our images of the wise men. The first section of the poem alone includes the words worst, sorefooted, regretted, grumbling, hostile and folly. Eliot imagines it was more of an ordeal than a cakewalk.

What's of equal interest is that Eliot wrote the poem in the same year of his own Christian conversion in the Church of England, 1927. Many interpreters of the poem imagine that it may be as much or more a meditation on his own inner journey than a muse on the wise men of old.

If so, Eliot's inner journey was dramatic, fascinating and worthwhile. A line from the poem says, I would do it again. But it was not easy. Perhaps the poem has endured in part because, in it, others recognize they are not alone in life's daunting passages or in committing to any genuine spiritual quest at all: With the voices singing in our ears, saying that this was all folly.

The wise men traveled together. Until the last line, Eliot's poem is written from the voice of 'we' and 'us'. And in the church, at our best, and through the worst, we travel together in faith. May it be said of us, now, in 2015 and beyond.






